Dear Friends,

As I write this the 2012 Olympic Games are coming to a close. There will be a short break then the Paralympics' Games will take over. Every day we have heard news of new medals being won by our British athletes, and new world records by others. The papers have been full of stories of great triumphs and distressing failures. Even those not interested in sport have been glued to their televisions.

For those involved in farming – in particular dairy farming, there are other battles being fought. The price they have been getting for milk has been unsustainable and it may be that many dairy farms may be lost for ever because of it. Then we have had the wettest summer I can remember, with a farmer in the Golden Valley only completing planting his potato fields at the end of July. Farmers have had to struggle to complete their silage harvests and it will be rare to see hay fields this year as the weather has been so unsettled. I know that combining the corn crops has been quite tricky as well, with some crops not yielding as hoped.

But for all of us, not just those in sports or farming, there are challenges we face every day, which can sometimes seem like real struggle. But we should keep up our efforts, a bit like athletes who have to battle on through pain and injury to achieve their hopes and dreams. And we can do this with the knowledge that, "in all things God works for good with those who love him." (Romans 8:28). And when things get really tough and you can't seem to find your way through all the difficulties that keep coming your way, please don't despair, but get in touch with either myself or one of our church members who will offer a sympathetic ear and who may be able to help practically as well. And we can certainly pray, in confidence, that God will help you through your dark hours.

And as the days begin to shorten the pressure is on for the church boiler to be sorted out when it turns cold. A huge THANK YOU to those involved in the Credenhill Canter, for their idea, for supporting the church (as well as SCBU) and for the great organisation, publicity and the huge amount of hard work put in to make the event work. As I write it hasn't happened yet but I'm very hopeful that it will be a real success because of the enthusiasm of those involved. I'll tell you more about it after I've completed the course!

Dear Constituents

The Herefordshire Council is to stop supplying black refuse sacks to residents this autumn. This is of considerable concern, because in my opinion it will without doubt greatly increase the risk of fly-tipping in the rural areas. It is also worth noting that if any waste of any description is dumped on private land, the landowner is fully responsible for its removal plus any costs involved.

I am pleased to report that the Road Safety Partnership Team attended the P.C. meeting on Wednesday July 18th to discuss the problem of speeding traffic in the area generally. They have agreed to place data collection boxes on the main A480 and Station Road as soon as the equipment becomes available. During the past few months, again because of complaints from local residents, I have arranged with the same team of Officers to have the speed of traffic monitored along the main A438 at Swainshill, which showed that seven out of ten drivers exceeded the 40mph limit. There will be further data collection and SPEEDING ENFORCEMENT taking place in that location over the next few months..... so you have been warned!

Unfortunately, AMEY are running behind schedule on a number of schemes, and so regretfully the improvements promised for Station Road will be slightly delayed.

There has been a further delay in the timetable for the Local Development Framework, as there are still matters outstanding to be resolved, together with further consultation to take place. A report will consequently be going to Cabinet in December 2012, but the final plan will not go before Full Council for consideration until July 2013.

Although this has been one of the wettest summers on record, at least we have had the visit of Her Majesty the Queen to cheer us up, and the spectacle of the Olympic Games in London to inspire us.

GARDENING by Doug Wellin



We're approaching the 'season of mists and mellow fruitfulness', when if you've got any fruit trees you can begin enjoying plums, damsons, the early varieties of apple and pear, and anticipate the later ones. It's also a time to start thinking about choosing fruit trees because the best time for planting is in the dormant season, any time between November and late February – though towards February they're already starting into growth, and I think the best month for the job is November when there's still some warmth in the soil. So the sooner you choose varieties and order them the better. For most gardens you'll need dwarfing stocks, which you can grow on their own as a small tree or bush, or as pillars, arches, cordons or espaliers. Although you can always pop to one of the local fruit farms and pick your own, there's something satisfying about having the blossom, watching the fruit develop and actually picking your own fruit from the garden and eating it fresh.

Summer-flowering annuals and perennials will have gone over and the annuals will need pulling out and the perennials cutting back; cut off all dead stalks. But it's not all over for flowers – the wonderful ranges of Michaelmas daisies will be coming into their own. There's a national collection at the Picton Garden at the far end of Colwall, just the other side of Ledbury, and it's a good place to see great drifts of them and to decide what you like and what you can use. Some varieties are too tall for small gardens except perhaps for the back of a border, and a few are susceptible to mildew, but they come in all heights up to 4 or 5 feet and some of the shorter varieties especially look splendid and are very usable. If you are looking them up in a book you'll probably find them under 'Aster' because all the Michaelmas daisies belong to the aster family. I can recommend a visit to the Picton Garden (also known as the Old Court Nursery) just to look, and you'll get as much information and advice there as out of a book.

Now is also the time to be planting daffodil and narcissus bulbs. Now that's living in the future! Divide and perhaps re-plant rock plants that are spreading beyond their permitted space. If you have a lawn, raise the cutting height of your mower so that you leave the grass at medium height – it doesn't do to cut it short at this time of the year, and in any case shaving it only encourages moss.



Aerating it with a garden fork stuck in and eased back a bit is also a good thing, especially if you liberally shower or brush sharp sand into the holes but also in general across the lawn, to improve drainage.
