Parish Meetings

The next Parish Meeting has been postponed to WEDNESDAY, 28 JUNE 2017 at the Youth and Resource Centre. All members of the public are encouraged to attend.

Parish Council

The Parish Council appointed Mr Terry Smissen as Chairman to replace Mr Andrew Round and Mr Andrew Slater remained Vice-Chairman at the meeting 17th May 2017.

The Parish Council Invites Parishioners to join the Parish as a Councillor

The Parish Council has vacancies for four councillors. Anyone wishing to be co-opted please contact the Clerk at <u>Clerk@credenhill-pc.org.uk</u> for an application form.

As a Councillor you are a democratically elected or co-opted local representative of all the parishioners of the village. You will be required to be unbiased in your decisions and support all the residents within the area covering the village.

Listed below are the responsibilities that are covered by the Council and which you will be invited to join and be responsible for reporting or advising to the Council and the Clerk:

- 1. <u>Community Hall:</u> (Councillor Adrian French). Attend the Hall meetings and report back to the Council on any issues that may concern the Parish.
- 2. <u>Footpaths</u>: (Councillor Paul Burridge). Report any issues regarding the footpaths within the boundaries of the village. Request assistance from outside agencies through the Clerk for work to be carried out that may cause concern over safety.
- 3. <u>Planning:</u> (Chairman Terry Smissen and Vice-Chairman Andrew Slater). Report on any issues from Planning Applications received from Herefordshire Council. Visit those dwellings that may be affected by any planning applications. Report on these issues and invite the occupants to make their own concerns through the Council web-site. Report any concerns over development that does not appear to have permission.
- 4. <u>Shops/Business</u>: (Councillor Mrs Dot Pullen). Liaise with the Shops and businesses that are visited by the general public on health and safety issues that may occur in their area.
- 5. <u>Schools</u>: (Councillor Mrs Emma Baxter). Liaise with Credenhill St. Mary Primary School. Create a communicative relationship and report on any issues that they wish the Council to know.
- 6. <u>Roman Park</u>: (Councillor Andrew Round). Report to the Council on issues regarding the play equipment, changing rooms, football pitch and sports areas. Investigate any breach of security and improper behaviour and report to the Council.
- 7. <u>Finance</u>: As part of the Finance Sub-committee you will be responsible for presenting the Precept to the Council to discuss and vote on for acceptance. In consultation with the Clerk keep an up-date on the finances of the Council.
- 8. Flood Alleviation Scheme: (Councillors John Bevan and Ray Rose). Liason and negotiation with the FAS project team regarding the Flood Alleviation Scheme and in particular the element of the plan concerning work on the community site at Credenhill.

If you feel that you would be able to attend a meeting every 3rd Wednesday of the month and assist in any of the responsibilities above please contact the Clerk.

The new Chairman, Mr Terry Smissen would be happy to meet any interested parties to advise them on their duties when serving on the Parish Council.

Parking:

Parking outside the school entrance on the brow of the hill is causing considerable concerns. However, consultations have been taking place and further details shall be published in the next CCN.

Shops:

The maintenance of the area at the front and back of the Doctors, Chip shop, One stop and Jasmine House restaurant is not the responsibility of the Parish Council. These two areas are in fact private land belonging to the businesses. The Parish Council frequently receive complaints especially regarding litter in the car park. The Parish Council has recently written to all the businesses and asked them to address these issues, and shall continue in their efforts to make this area a litter-free place.

Planning:

No planning applications were received.

Roman Park:

The Zip Wire at Roman Park shall be replaced, as the post has become rotten and is not safe. The Parish Council shall be conducting a survey of the play equipment at Roman Park and hopefully shall carry out further improvements.

Neighbourhood Development Plan:

The Parish Council has as yet not commenced a Neighbourhood Development Plan. The N.D.P. allows the parishioners along with the Parish Council to decide where and what type of development should happen in Credenhill. The plan can also protect open spaces and the parish boundary. Without the plan being in place future developments will be determined by the guidelines set out in the core strategy, a document concerning Herefordshire's local plan 2011-2031. The N.D.P. will need local people to be involved and work with the members of the Parish Council. Stephanie Kitto, Neighbourhood Planning Officer from Herefordshire Council shall be attending the Parish Council, 28 June 2017.

REVIEW **Fittest**

Magna Director: Betty Morris Venue: The Powell Theatre

This is the third play, written by the amazing Betty Morris, set in the imaginary 'Sparkle Deluxe Spa and Health and Club'. In true farce fashion, chaos reigned at a nice rapid pace from the moment the play started and what a giggle we had. That's not quite correct as we had some real laugh out loud moments.

I can honestly say that there was so much going on that I was not sure who to watch at times; great direction had every cast member doing something every time they were on. I loved Dan Hoskins as the apprentice chef, breaking into song with some highly creative dance moves as he cleaned the tables, not to mention his face when he was told to do three things all at once. Maureen Baker reprised her Irish character Angie as the completely pickled cook. Paul Oliver was convincing as the nightmare club member who, on damaging his ankle, did a brilliant job of changing his leg every two minutes until the audience (let alone himself) couldn't remember which one was supposed to be injured. Daniel Beer was perfect as the Health Inspector; his stoicism was highly amusing.

Sarah Hare again played the indomitable Health club owner, Helen Sparks. How she kept a straight face when she was drinking what she thought was a new line in coffee flavours, I'll never know. The audience was in fits of laughter at the improbability of the situation but it was very cleverly acted out with the said cup being slickly passed from one to the other. Hilary Jones was again Magda the Russian cleaner who found herself right in the thick of the action all the way though. Her energy and comic timing was brilliant and the little touches that, as I said earlier, was going on all the time had me tittering throughout.

David Jones did an excellent job as Justin, the hapless husband and father of five. This is a role that really suits David and he gave a confident performance. The interaction between him and Laura Gwynne who played Chell the receptionist was fast paced and utterly believable. Laura Gwynne was superb in this role that she has made her own. Her characterisation, delivery and timing was faultless; my sides ached during her explanation of her husband's infidelity resulting in the arrival of 'Jesus' which led Helen into believing that Chell was having a breakdown. This was not helped by Catherine Donativo's attempts to get Chell in trouble. Catherine was great as the mischievous and sneaky fitness instructor whose deviousness didn't get her anywhere in the end. Another great performance from Catherine.

Two cameo roles from Betty Morris as Queenie and Andrew Jones as Jesus completed the line-up for this hysterically funny play set in the Sparkle Deluxe Spa and Health Club. It was a stroke of genius finishing with the macarena. I can't wait for the next one! This production was so familiar as most of the cast slipped back onto characters they had played before; it was like putting on a favourite coat that was fresh back from the cleaners!




