## Your community needs you

The Parish Council still has 5 councillor vacancies out of 14 positions; this means that the council has limited resource to carry out projects in addition to the day to day running of the parish. If you would like to get involved then the clerk would be happy to meet and discuss the position with anyone in the parish.

## Next Meeting

19<sup>th</sup> December 2018 from 19:30 to 21:30 at the Youth and Resource Centre, all members of the public and press are welcome to attend. Our main topic at this meeting will be the budget; we will also be discussing future plans for the Roman Park Development as well as Orchard House.

## Update received from the Orchard House developers:

*Further to our ongoing discussions with the Parish Council we can confirm that we will be shortly submitting to Herefordshire Council an outline application for up to 69 houses on land at Orchard House, Credenhill. Whilst submitted in outline with detailed layout and design matters to be addressed at a later stage the application pack will be comprehensive and deal with all pertinent matters. The feedback the parish council has been kind enough to offer over the last months has been invaluable and has led us to engage with officers of HCC at an early stage, most notably the highways team as we know from the parish council that highway and pedestrian safety will be a key consideration and to this end the only matter that will be dealt with in detail at this stage will be access so that the matter can be fully addressed to the satisfaction of the county and the parish*

*In addition, we will continue our discussions with local landowners as the application progresses in the hope that improvements can be made to pedestrian linkages within the wider village. We can also confirm that the application will be supported by a S106 legal agreement which will address those matters identified to us by the planning authority that the development should support. These matters will become clearer as the application progresses but examples (not exhaustive) from other developments would include education, affordable housing, open space, formal play/sport areas and highway improvements (as above).*

## Draft Budget for 2019-2020

Credenhill is the 15<sup>th</sup> largest authority in Herefordshire which is made up of approximately 136 authorities yet last year the precept per house in Credenhill ranked at 83<sup>rd</sup> in the list. The average Parish precept in Herefordshire last year was £48.62 per Band D equivalent household yet Credenhill Band D equivalent was only £36.05. So the statistics alone clearly show that we are underfunding the village. If we want to maintain and improve amenities then we need to financially plan more effectively going forward.

This year we have produced a comprehensive draft budget which will be finalised this month; you can find the full details on the website under November's Minutes/Agenda ([www.credenhill-pc.org.uk](http://www.credenhill-pc.org.uk)) however if you do not have internet access then please get in touch with the clerk who will be glad to help. ## The Vicar's Letter

Dear Friends,

I know that your churchwarden, Dorrie Coates, will give a more detailed report on our Remembrance Sunday activities, but here I would like to say a huge 'Thank you' to her and her team of energetic helpers who decorated the village with poppies and organised everything for a truly memorable day. Also 'thank you' to the Parish Council for the WW1 Airman silhouette under the conker tree and for the grant towards the costs of the ration box lunches after the service.

We now turn our thoughts towards Christmas...

This year in St Mary's Church our festival is about Angels. If you pop up to the church after December 14<sup>th</sup> you will find angels all over the place! Angels feature a lot in the story of the birth of Christ. The term 'angel' literally means 'messenger'. St Luke chapter 1 describes how the angel Gabriel appeared to Mary, who was to become the mother of Jesus. He told her, *'The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you. So the baby born to you will be holy, and he will be called the Son of God...'* Mary responded with the words, *'I am the Lord's servant, and I am willing to accept whatever he wants...'* Mary's obedience to God brought salvation to the world. Luke goes on to tell us how she told her cousin, Elizabeth, *'My soul is full of joy in God my Saviour'* (Luke 1:47).

When we obey God's calling to us, whatever it is, he fills us with joy. He may be calling us to do something good for someone, to forgive someone who has wronged us, to say something kind to a stranger or to give money to someone in need.

There is a story of a poor single mum with three children who in the Christmas school holiday, decided that their home was so cold she would take her children to a local café for a bit to eat and to warm up. She ordered the children some food and herself a bowl of soup. While they waited for the food to arrive, the children entertained their mum singing carols they'd learned in school. After they had eaten the waitress stopped by their table and asked if they'd like desert, so the mother who had very little money, ordered a slice of lemon meringue pie for the children to share and checked her purse to see if she had enough for a tip as well. After they'd finished desert she looked to ask the waitress for her bill and was told, "It's taken care of. Someone has paid for you! They said they enjoyed the entertainment!" I'm certain that the person who paid for that family's meal left the café with joy in their heart!

May you find that joy as you learn to listen and obey God's calling to help others this Christmas!



The Royal British Legion theme to commemorate the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the end of WW1 was Thank You. Our report this month is full of Thanks.

A very big Thank you to everyone who helped to make Credenhill's Remembrance Display and service such a memorable event. Poppies were made by several individuals in the village as well as the Scouts and Cubs, Brownies and Rainbows



and the school. Headway's display which included a life sized painting of a soldier, and a cascade of ceramic poppies was impressive. Mark Jones provided life sized silhouettes of standing and kneeling soldiers and an airman which added to the amazing outdoor displays. Thank you. The church was filled with numerous displays created by the Brownies, Rainbows, Cubs, after-school club and ladies of the village who have been knitting for several months. The windows, furnishings and arches were decorated by Jean Bowles, Paula Fitch, Jean Wells' daughter, Don Coates and myself. Jean Bowles created a display in memory of her grandfather and I created a display about the soldiers who died in WW1.



Many thanks to Jean Wells who allowed us to hold poppy making workshops in her home which helped to create a sense of community and brought us together.

**Thank you** to members of the village who put displays up in their gardens or windows, which greatly enhanced the feeling of community. **Thank you** to the ladies who made up the replica gift boxes and filled them and/or made soup for lunch. **Thank you** to Tom Fitch and the helpers who prepared the school hall for the service. **Thank you** to Donna Jones for making the service meaningful and accessible for all ages. We pray that her theme of peace and hope will become the future for our children. **Thank you** to the school children who planted poppies for each of the Credenhill service men who lost their lives in WW1. **Thank you** to Mike Honeysett, Callum and Kieran Dover who rang the bells at 12:30 with many others across the country.

Rev Rana printed 100 order of service booklets, but over 250 people of all ages joined in the parade and service of Remembrance. We served 140 lunch boxes and 71 beakers of soup.



Finally, thank you to the Parish council who provided the RBL silhouette and sponsored the event.

All this will help us all to Remember.

Many protesters were killed and hundreds more injured, sparking a nationwide outcry but also further government suppression. The Peterloo Massacre was a defining moment in British democracy which also played a significant role in the founding of The Guardian newspaper.


