Parish Meetings

The next Parish meeting is to be held on **WEDNESDAY 11 DECEMBER 2013** at the Youth and Resource centre (preschool). All members of the public are encouraged to attend.

Parish clerk

The present parish clerk/ responsible finance officer has notified the parish council that she wishes to resign from her position. We are now looking for a suitable replacement. Brief description of duties include:

- Attendance of parish meetings (usually one evening each month)
- Producing minutes and agendas for parish meetings.
- Deal with all correspondence (including email, telephone)
- Maintain all parish records (including planning and electoral)
- Maintain the parish accounts (including RTI, vat and yearly audits)

The hours per week are on average 10. The hourly rate starts at £8.50 per hour (depending on experience) and includes 5.6 weeks pro rata holiday per year. A laptop and printer is also provided. If you are interested in this post then please contact me for further information.

Neighbourhood planning

Many thanks to all those that responded to the recent neighbourhood plan form. 840 resident's surveys were published. 259 voted in favour of a plan being produced with 6 against. The parish council will now contact Hereford council to inform them that they intend to proceed.

The Parish council has received the following planning application: Development of land adjacent to Cross Farm. This application is ongoing with a site visit due soon.

Sharaine (132569, 2 semi detached dwellings) The parish council has requested an extension to the closing date for comments.

Greenways, Mill Lane, (132828/F erection of 3 bungalows). The parish council has no comments to make on this application.

Members of the parish council agreed to purchase 4 green bins to be installed around the village to encourage local residents to pick up after their dogs and use the bins to dispose of their waste. Please bag it and bin it!

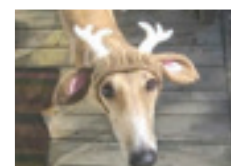

Churchwardens Report.



Around 137 people attended the Remembrance Service led by Rev Rana which started at the war memorial and continued in the school.

It was both traditional and contemporary to include all ages. We began with the reading of the list of lives lost, the Last Post, the 2 minutes silence and the Reveille. Wreaths were laid by the Royal British Legion, RAF, Navy and the Parish Council.

Poppies and flowers were laid by the Brownies and members of the congregation. Tom Fitch read the traditional bible reading whilst Amber Coates read a Child's Poem from the National Arboretum. Donna Jones gave the talk using the analogy of the difficulties of driving in fog following the cats' eyes and vehicle lights to following the path of Jesus. She then went on to include children from the congregation in the telling of the story of the 6 Blind Men and the Elephant, encouraging us all to listen to others' points of view and therefore avoiding conflict. The service concluded with the National Anthem during which the Union Flag and standards for the Scouts, Cubs, Beavers and Brownies were dipped. £130 was collected for the Poppy Appeal Fund.

- The Church has to raise £15,000 annually to pay the Parish Share and to date this year we have paid £14,250. Hopefully we can raise the shortfall which will ensure the future of an active church in our village.
- We have recently received a gift of seating pads for the pews, through friends of Jean and Roy Crew, which will make it warmer and more comfortable and we are grateful to Julian Lyndesay for collecting these for us.
- If your organisation is putting up a Christmas Tree please can you do this before Sunday 8th December and we are still looking for people to come along and entertain us on Friday 13th December. If you enjoy singing either as a solo or a in a group please ring myself Dorrie Coates 761935 or Donna Jones 761056.
- If you would like to donate money for flowers at Christmas to remember a friend or family member please let Jean Hawkings Bowles know. We will be decorating the church prior to the Crib Service. Volunteers are welcome to come and help.
- Over the year we have supported the Community Larder with gifts of groceries and other essentials. Our next collection will be at the Christmas Tree Service when we will collect items for the Christmas Season.

Dear Friends,

This issue of the *CCN* covers quite a lot of the Church calendar! It begins with Advent, the time of year that many children begin their countdown to Christmas day by opening a little door on an Advent calendar each day - I still do this! For Christians, Advent is a time of expectant waiting and preparation for the celebration of the Nativity of Jesus at Christmas. It is also the beginning of the Church year. Many churches hold Advent Courses, where participants learn more about their faith. In the past we have done this in Credenhill, but this year we plan something a bit different. The course we are doing is called 'Action Advent'. Church members will meet together to be briefed before going out into the village, where we will be knocking on doors to ask if there is anything that the occupants would like us to pray for in confidence. It might be someone who is ill, or an event that is coming up, or it could be someone who needs work. We will pray for that person or situation for one week then pop back to the house to see if it has made a difference. Church members will be trained and supervised for this. We do hope that you will try it out if we knock on your door!

Then comes Christmas and details of our Christmas services are elsewhere in the *CCN*. But we hope that you will enjoy the opportunity to celebrate the 'real Christmas' at one of our churches in the Magnis Group: there is surely a service or an occasion to suite all tastes and ages - do give it a try. Most people say that celebrating the 'real Christmas' makes the season very special for them. If anyone would like to receive Holy Communion at Christmas but is too unwell to attend church, I am always very happy to bring communion to you at home. Please telephone me to arrange it.

In the New Year we remember the time when the Wise Men visited the holy family and brought gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. The date for this is twelve days after Christmas on the 6th of January. The Sunday closest to the 6th is also traditionally known as 'Plough Sunday'. In olden days this was the day before the farm workers went back to work in the fields preparing for planting, and we are holding a Plough Sunday service at Bishopstone Church on Sunday 5th January at 10.00am. It will be an interesting and unusual service with tractors and ploughs a main feature! It will be very suitable for all ages to enjoy!

Of course this issue of the *CCN* covers January and the New Year begins. In Matthew chapter 6 Jesus tells us not to worry about tomorrow, for it brings worries of its own. Today's troubles are enough for today! But none of us can help wondering what the coming year will bring. There are always good times and bad. Do remember that your church here in Credenhill is here to help you through those times of celebration and sadness; it is something that we do particularly well. Do think of us when you need help for baptisms/ Christenings, weddings and funerals during the year. We aim to be welcoming and helpful and have a wealth of experience to offer. Just phone me to arrange a visit.

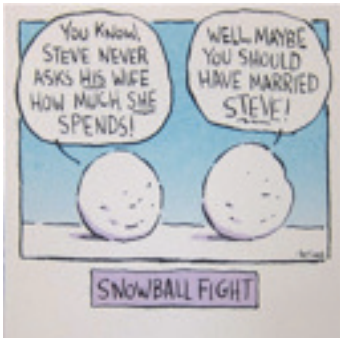

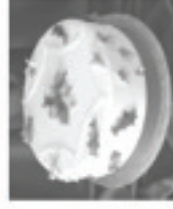

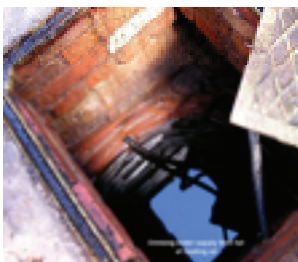


Woodland News at Credenhill Park Wood

We had a good day looking for wildlife at the Credenhill Park Wood Bioblitz back at the end of September. Different types of experts came along to look for many different types of wildlife and to help people discover these for the first time too. We searched for small rodents (mice and voles) but weren't lucky enough to find any. It doesn't mean they aren't there – just that we didn't see them! We found 2 toads and a Great Crested Newt – which was a brilliant find as Great Crested Newts are a European Protected Species. We also found 39 different types of fungi. Little explores came out and found beetles, millipedes and other minibeasts and were able to look at these closely under magnifying glasses before letting them go again. Others took the opportunity to learn more about identifying the various plants found at Credenhill Park Wood and the many different types of trees. We hope to run something similar again so look out for a second Bioblitz taking place in the future.

Tree Felling continues during the winter (weather permitting) and it is a time of year when the site managers are looking at the tree branches for signs of disease – it is easier to look at these when they are no longer in leaf. This is specifically for trees along the public paths so that can we can try to deal with them before they fall down in a strong wind or under the weight of heavy snow.

Winter can feel a bleak time of year –with the cold, wet days and dark nights, but it can be a great time of year to explore woods. With the trees being bare and the vegetation dying back there is more opportunity to see the birds in the trees and perhaps a deer in the distance. Frosty mornings leave us a glimpse of the wildlife we often do not see – thousands of spiders webs are highlighted, sparkling with a frosty covering, showing off their intricate designs and different patterns. If we get a covering of snow then head out to the wood the next day and you will see evidence of how much wildlife is in a wood, with lots of different paw prints being left by various creatures that often come out a night hunting for food. Nothing is better at making you feel refreshed, in my opinion, than a brisk walk in a wood and coming back with a warm glow to a warm house and hot drink or bowl of soup!

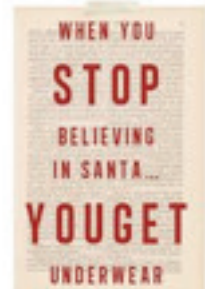

Circles of Support for Isolated People

Isolation can be a big problem, and it can be especially difficult for those who have disabilities. Often their only independent support comes from parents and family. Parents are often concerned about what will become of their loved one once they are no longer around to speak up for them and care for them.

One solution is to dispel isolation by surrounding the individual with a circle of friends. A circle of friends can provide support and back-up and have a really positive long-term impact on an individual's life.

But how do isolated people, especially those with a disability, find a supportive circle of friends?

New organisation ACSYL has some practical ideas. Indeed ACSYL (an acronym for A Circle Supporting You for Life) has already set up a circle for one man, 'John', in Hereford, and is busy setting up support circles for three more people in the County.

'John' is already benefitting from the ideas and contacts his circle is sharing with him. So far, his social life has improved and his circle of friends has been working out ways he can reach his goal of a trip to Europe for a significant birthday coming up in the next year or so.

As his circle grows closer and gets to know him better, John will find other advantages coming his way: he'll have a group of friends willing to act as advocates on his behalf, he may learn new skills and find new ways of dealing with some of life's problems.

John's parents feel more confident about his future now. Knowing that there are other people taking an active interest in their son means the parents can relax. John's new friends will notice if his house needs repair, they'll see when he's not happy and can follow up to find the cause, and perhaps best of all, John knows that if he needs support he has a circle of friends to turn to. He's no longer on his own or totally reliant on aging parents.

The heart of John's circle is his Community Connector. The Community Connector not only builds the circle, but also ensures it continues to function in the long-term.

ACSYL is looking for more Community Connectors to work part time, flexible hours. The work can be very rewarding. If you are interested in this kind of work, or if you would like to find out more about having a circle built for someone in your family, please contact ACSYL.
