### Churchwardens' Report.

February has been a quieter month when we plan the events for the rest of the year. We have a varied social programme with all events open to the whole community. Not all of the events are fund raising and our February activities have provided free, fun activities for all ages.

The church was decorated to celebrate 'love' for St Valentine's weekend which started with Messy Church on a theme of Love and friendship. 11 children and their parents took part in several activities: decorating cakes and heart shaped biscuits, heart shaped key rings, fondant chocolate hearts, wooden 'love' hangers, mosaic coaster, mini gift bags of, woven hearts, Valentine's Day cards and posies of roses. Donna told us the story of the Good Samaritan and we finished with tea. Everyone was given a heart shaped balloon.

The All Aged Service on Sunday continued the theme. We thought about all the different kinds of love - love for partners, family, friends, enduring love, compassionate love, love of fun things etc. Rev Rana blessed representatives of all the different groups including Jean and Dennis Jones who were celebrating 57 years of marriage.

Donna represented God's Love for us all with a square of paper asking how many corners there were. We all confidently answered 4 and she asked whether we could do the sum 4-1, Again we all confidently answered 3. However when she cut off one corner we found that she had 5 corners. She repeated this with the remaining corners and each time when she took one corner away 2 more were created. Each piece that was cut off was given to another person so they had 3 more corners and she explained that God's love continued to grow the more we gave to others and if we continued to cut off each corner we would end up with a circle and God's love is like a circle, eternally encircling us with no ending.

Everyone in the congregation was given a rose posy and a confectionary favour before enjoying cakes and biscuits provided by the 'activities' group members.

The 6 churches of the United Benefice are providing soup lunches throughout Lent at Mansell Lacy Church There are 3 in March - 3<sup>rd</sup>, 10<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup>. These are open to everyone for a donation. We hope to have another series of soup and cheese lunches in Advent.

Our next fund raising event is the Barn Dance at 7pm at the Community Hall with Whiffeldy. This takes place on Saturday, March 12<sup>th</sup> and is organised by Gordon Batchelor and his family. Tickets are £10 for adults and £4 for children including supper.

Now may the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, that you may abound in hope by the power of the Holy Spirit. Romans 15:13

Dear Friends,

Lent began this week heralded by our annual glut of pancakes the day before. For many people Lent is associated with giving up something; an opportunity, perhaps, for kicking that unwanted habit, or for going on that diet begun at New Year and forgotten by the end of January! This year Lent is very early with Easter falling on the last week-end in March, so we are still very much in winter.

In a way, it's helpful to go through Lent in winter knowing that spring is just around the corner. I am sometimes asked why God lets bad things happen to good people and I think the answer is linked closely with the Easter story. As we approach Easter we hear more of the incredible journey of Jesus towards his cross. This week in church we will be thinking of Jesus being tempted in the wilderness by the devil, 'Obey me' cries Satan, 'and you can have the world *without* the cross!' Times of trial can be times of temptation for us too; we could simply stop trusting in God to help us through, or we could hang on in there, ask him to show us how to cope, and for strength to get through; to show us a way through the dark valley we find ourselves; to help us to bear the cross we carry. For some people the end might seem bleak, or they cannot see a way through their difficulty, but resurrection cannot come without the cross. It is the cross that gives us hope.

If at this time you find that you are going through a dark valley of any kind (struggling to bear a cross), be it illness, the agony of caring for a loved one in pain, bereavement, financial crisis, loneliness or anything else, and you would like a safe person to talk to about it, do contact me. I am a good listener and would be glad to help you through your time of trial and to help you find the hope and joy of Easter.

West Mercia Horse Watch is a scheme set up to connect all horse owners and riders with the intention of improving our security and communication. We aim to reduce rural and equine crime and just like Neighbourhood Watch, much can be achieved through general awareness and a little effort from each individual.

### SNT 3 Day Village Focus

Hereford Rural North SNT have come up with an initiative to enable us to spend some concentrated time on each of our larger villages. We're calling it 3 Day Village Focus and have started on Monday 4th Jan in Wellington.

The idea is to show a visible presence in the designated village with vehicle and foot patrols both AM/PM (\*dependant of our shift/availability).

We visit local businesses incl schools, shops and pubs etc

Gather local 'intelligence' from residents related to suspicious vehicles, drugs, crime etc

Visits to vulnerable and elderly people

Listen to community concerns and take action where possible

Give crime prevention advice to local farms, businesses and residents etc.

Our first village was Wellington where we delivered over 150 leaflets within the main village, detailing our contact details.

PC Cullen and PCSO Ekanite were informed of an abandoned vehicle in Millway, Wellington during a morning footpatrol in the village. By 4pm the vehicle was seized for being untaxed! The same result was recently achieved in Cranwell Drive, Credenhill more recently after we were notified by the local housing officer.

We won't be able to remain permanently in the village over each 3 day period but once our jobs and commitments are complete the aim is to default back to the village focused on for that day.

Residents, Councillors, Housing Officers etc are more than welcome to join us on a footpatrol of the area.

We've tried to include as many of the larger villages as possible, including the neighbouring village but this is by no means an extensive list of the areas we cover as a team. We will however, continue to patrol and respond to those smaller areas as usual.

## Make Sunday the highlight of your month

***Gladys is 90 and has been a guest of Contact the Elderly for many years:***

“Contact still means a lot to me each month. It seems that some folk have never heard of Contact. If they ask me about it I try to explain that small Contact groups are all over the country in towns and villages. Every group has an organiser and she arranges friends and volunteers with cars. Next has to be arranged twelve venues (one for each month) and a hostess who is willing for the group to meet at her house for a simple tea twice a year.

A Contact group is kept small, 6 to 10 members, so that everyone can chat to everyone else. Each month on a Sunday afternoon, rain or shine, the drivers collect the members and take us for a little drive to where we are made welcome and have tea. There is a lot of talk and laughter during tea and somebody will tell us what they have been doing since our last meeting.

Always there is something to look forward to - friends to meet, ideas to be exchanged. Time goes all too quickly but when we say goodbye we all feel that the loneliness has been lifted, that we have plenty of friends and kind people that really care and we all have another get-together to look forward to in a month's time.”

### **What does Contact the Elderly offer?**

Contact the Elderly groups have been running for over 49 years. Volunteers offer companionship one Sunday afternoon a month for people over 75 who live alone, are unable to get out and about without help and have lost touch with family and friends.

### **What does each Contact the Elderly group do?**

Older people are invited to join a small group of volunteer drivers and other older guests for an afternoon get-together one Sunday afternoon a month. It is a great way to make new friends of all ages.

### **What do Contact the Elderly volunteers do?**

Your regular volunteer driver will come to your door, walk with you to their car and drive you to the place where you all spend the afternoon together. The get-togethers usually start at 3.00 pm and ends at 5.30 pm. You will be collected in time to have a pleasurable drive to the host's home and at the end of the afternoon the driver will take you home safely.

### **Where do we visit for afternoon tea?**

Each group of volunteer drivers and their older guests visit a volunteer's home each month. Different homes are visited throughout the year.

Your hosts will usually provide a lovely afternoon tea.

### **When would you take me out?**

One Sunday afternoon each month - so you will have a regular date on your calendar to look forward to.

### **Are there any costs?**

There are no charges involved at all.

### **How are the groups organised?**

Contact the Elderly has groups in many different parts of the UK. Each group is run by a group coordinator. S/he makes the arrangements for each month's visit to a volunteer host and will let your volunteer driver know where you are going.

## Raspberry pain au chocolat



### Ingredients

Serves: 18

- 1 (500g) packet puff pastry
- 6 tablespoons chocolate hazelnut spread (Nutella®)
- 3 tablespoons raspberry jam
- 1 egg, beaten
- 4 tablespoons icing sugar for dusting (optional)

### Method

Prep:20min > Cook:18min > Ready in:38min

- 1 Preheat the oven to 200 C / Gas 6.
- 2 Unfold the puff pastry sheets on a lightly floured surface. Cut each one into thirds along the fold lines. Roll each strip of pastry out to about 40cm long, and cut strips into thirds.
- 3 Spread some of the hazelnut spread onto one half of each rectangle to within 1cm of the edge. Spread about 1/2 teaspoon of the raspberry jam over the hazelnut spread. Brush the edges with egg, and fold over the other side to enclose the filling. Press the edges firmly to seal. Repeat with the remaining rectangles. Use a sharp knife to cut slits across the top of each pastry, and place them on baking trays, spacing 5cm apart.
- 4 Bake for 18 minutes in the preheated oven, or until golden brown. Cool on racks. Dust with icing sugar when cooled if desired.
