DOGS & CATS FIREWORKS & PETS

ALWAYS

ALWAYS – keep dogs and cats inside when fireworks are being let off.

ALWAYS – close all windows and doors, and block off cat flaps to stop pets

escaping and to keep noise to a minimum. Draw the curtains, and if the animals

are used to the particular sounds of TV or radio, switch them on but not too

loudly in order to block out some of the noise of the fireworks.

ALWAYS – make sure your pet is wearing some form of easily readable

identification (ID) – even in the house. By law, they should have at least a collar

and tag, but think about fitting them with a microchip, so that if they do run away

they have a better chance of being returned to you.

NEVER

NEVER – take your dog to a firework display. Even if your dog does not bark or whimper at fireworks it doesn't mean he's happy. Excessive panting and yawning can sometimes indicate that your dog is stressed.

NEVER – tie your dog up outside while fireworks are being let off, i.e. outside a shop whilst you pop inside, or leave them in the garden or in your car.

NEVER – walk your dog while fireworks are going off. Make sure your dog is walked earlier in the day before the fireworks start.

NEVER – shout at your pet if it is frightened, as you will only make it more stressed.

YOU CAN HELP BY:

- preparing a 'den' for your pet so it can feel comfortable, perhaps under a bed with some of your old clothes where it can hide when the fireworks start
- if your pet does pace around, whines or meows and tries to hide in a corner, leave it alone and do not try to coax it out. It is just trying to find safety and should not be disturbed.
- trying not to leave your pet alone during such potentially upsetting events
- staying calm and acting normally. Praise your pet when it is calm.
- if you leave your pet alone and come back to find that it has been destructive, do not shout or get angry.

SMALL ANIMALS

Rabbits, guinea pigs, hamsters, gerbils, mice, ferrets and birds all need to be treated with special care when fireworks are being let off. These animals are easily frightened. The Blue Cross advises that owners of such types of small animal should follow these precautions.

- Hutches/cages and enclosures should, if possible, be brought into a quiet room indoors, or into a garage or shed
- Give your pet extra bedding to burrow into so it feels safe
- If you cannot bring your pet's hutch inside, you should turn its enclosure around so that it faces a wall or fence instead of the open garden
- Cover any aviaries or hutches with thick blankets or a duvet to block out the sight of the fireworks and deaden the sound of the bangs, **but make sure there is enough ventilation**

POST OFFICE/STORES

Important Notice

I have previously explained to customers and readers of this newsletter that as Sub-postmistress, I am self employed and that the Post Office and Stores are interdependent. The Post Office definitely cannot survive without a store or business of some kind bringing in extra income.

I receive a small monthly amount to assist in running the post office and the remainder of the income is derived from commission on our sales. The Post Office income has now been decreasing - due mainly to lost custom as customers change to direct debit and/or use online facilities, and also because the post office has renegotiated contracts with companies we represent and the commission we receive for completing these transactions is usually reduced. Stamps and small postings are only a very small part of our business. We rely on products such as banking, currency, special delivery, car tax, opening savings accounts and premium bonds etc. to make the higher commission.

No matter what I have tried, the Stores has never reached its predicted turnover. I just cannot find products that my customers will buy on a regular basis – not even Kleeneze!

I have tried to sell my home to move somewhere smaller and maintain a 'lock-up' post office. I have tried to sell both my home and business in order that the post office business continues. I have also approached various agencies for funding. None of these strategies has been successful.

I greatly regret that because of the above I am unable to make a living and pay my bills, so unless there is an unexpected 'miracle', I have given notice to Post Office Limited. Credenhill Post Office and Stores **WILL CEASE TRADING AT THE END OF JANUARY 2011.**

CREDENHILL PARISH COUNCIL NEWSLETTER

Following are a few points I would like to bring to your attention:

Parish Warden

With effect from 1 Oct 10, the parish warden for Credenhill has resigned. The parish clerk is currently negotiating with the Red Cross to find a replacement; details will be published when available.

Foot/cycle path to Stretton Sugwas

I am delighted to inform you that notification has been received from Herefordshire County Council that work will commence on the foot/cycle path in March 2011; the project is scheduled for completion in May 2011. (there is an outside possibility that dependent on other factors, the start date might be brought forward). Our thanks to District Councillor Bob Matthews who has, on our behalf, worked tirelessly to obtain this much sought after facility.

Roman Park

We are currently looking at quotes to refurbish the surrounds and surface area of the rope climbing tower and the re-instatement of the missing basketball net. We also have plans to reduce the amount of weeds on the grass areas and to undertake some restoration work in the goal mouths of the football pitch, this work will be carried out in the Spring next year.

Drains/sewer Survey

Despite frequent complaints about the inadequacy of the sewer system in Credenhill, the recent survey of the sewers/drains (published in the CCN) only attracted 19 responses. The parish clerk has collated the information received and has sent it off to Herefordshire Council and asked for their comments on the results of the survey. (A copy of the survey is shown after this article) Further information will be published when the comments of Herefordshire Council are received. In the case of the Persimmon estate, the parish clerk has been continually "nagging" Persimmon management to get the sewers adopted by Welsh Water, unfortunately progress is slow, the latest enquiry has revealed that Persimmon engineers are having difficulty in obtaining access to the nearby military base to assess the condition of the main sewers. You have my assurance that we, as a parish council, keep trying to resolve this situation.

Parish Precept

During the Parish Council Meeting on 20 Oct, the Parish Council resolved that the current precept (£16.000) would need to be increased by 5% to keep apace with increasing service charges. The total precept figure is now £16.800.

Dog Control Orders

You will probably be aware that the new Dog Control Orders issued by Herefordshire Council come into effect on 25 Oct 10. (notices placed in local papers) As part of the new legislation, the Roman Park and play area at Dovecote Lane have now been officially designated as dog free areas. There is a possibility that Herefordshire Council Dog Wardens will be around the village in the next to observe activity with dogs and their owners.

Parish Council Meeting

The next Parish Council Meeting will be held on Wed 24 Nov 10, this is a change to the original date of 17 Nov 10

PERSIMMON HOUSES

CREDENHILL PARISH COUNCIL

The floods and heavy snowfalls in recent years have highlighted the need to formulate a plan to deal with environmental - and other – local emergencies that may occur from time to time. In widespread or national emergencies such as severe flooding or prolonged snowfall, any assistance that the village requires from public services may be delayed. To this end Credenhill Parish Council is formulating an Emergency Action Plan to help cope with potential local emergency situations in the short term.

The Emergency Action Plan would need to include a list of volunteers who would be willing to help out if these situations occur. The volunteers could help with such things as;

- Assisting in evacuating disabled and vulnerable people to a place of safety.
- Assist in clearing snow to allow access to disabled and vulnerable people's properties so that assistance can be given.
- Helping to deliver foodstuffs to disabled and vulnerable people in prolonged snowfall.
- Or anything else that may help that particular situation.

Volunteers would not be expected to carry out any potentially dangerous or hazardous actions.

Also if anybody has equipment or skills that could be used to assist with this plan such as;

- Portable generators and lighting.
- A 4X4 vehicle that could be used to evacuate people through snow or floods.
- Any medical qualifications.
- Radio communications equipment.

Or anything else.

The emergency action plan is still being formulated but if you would be willing to add your name to the list of volunteers or you want to find out more about the plan please contact;

A resident recently made enquiries to the Parish Council footpaths officer regarding some Hereford bulls that graze in a field on which a footpath crosses. He was unsure of how safe the cattle were when people use the path. The footpath in question runs across the field from the old Roman road track known locally as the 'bridle path' and ends at the metal kissing gate by the stables in Mill Lane. Enquiries were made at the farm and information was gained that the Hereford cattle breed is naturally quite placid and should not pose any threat to walkers. However please consider that any animal - even a treasured pet - has the capacity to become agitated or aggressive if threatened or provoked

We do not hold a formal open evening, but instead, prefer to show prospective parents around the school on an individual/small group basis.






