Dear Friends,

Church life continues to be very busy and last month on possibly the worst weather on a Saturday this year, we had a Messy Christingle at the school, with lots of messy activities to keep us busy and a short service at the end, thinking about Jesus as the Light of the world. These 'Messy' events are great fun and enjoyed by all who attend (young and old and in-between), so do keep an eye out for the next one and come and try it out!

The latest on the church boiler is that we are now getting quotes for work to be done. It looks as though we will need between £8,000 and £10,000, but at the end of it all we should be better off with a more efficient boiler (costing less to run) as well as having running water piped up to the church. Amazingly, with the generosity of local people we have so far raised over £700. But we have a long way to go yet! In the meantime it has been so cold in church, hot water bottles and blankets have been a must. So we are hoping to hold services at the school until the weather gets warmer. Keep an eye out for notices about this.

We will be holding a Lent course at The Vicarage (8 Hillside View) every Thursday morning at 9.30am – 11.00am beginning on 1st March. We will be focussing on Mark's Gospel account of Jesus' final days before the crucifixion. It won't be heavy or theologically challenging (not my style), but it will, hopefully, help us all to think about the huge cost that Jesus paid for us when he gave himself up on the cross. You will be very welcome to join us if you can. And after that we can provide lifts to Mansel Lacy for the Lent lunches (soup and a roll), which on two of the Thursdays will help to raise money for Credenhill Church (Lent Lunches are available every Thursday from 12noon until 2.00pm).

Palm Sunday falls on April Fools Day, when we will be having a donkey joining us for a Sunday morning procession from the village shop to the school. It would be lovely to welcome the children of the village to this special service, which will be child-friendly, and they might even get to ride on Daisy-May along the way!
