Dear Friends,

Eastertide continues for Forty days after Easter Day. It seems odd to call it Eastertide when Easter is clearly over, but these are the forty days during which the Risen Christ appeared again and again to his disciples, following his death and resurrection and we will hear some of these stories read in church over the Sundays leading up to Ascension Day, which this year falls on May 17th when Eastertide officially ends.

The Gospels give us little of Christ's teachings and deeds during those forty days. Jesus was seen by numerous disciples: on the road to Emmaus, by the Sea of Galilee, in houses, etc. He strengthened and encouraged his disciples, and at last opened their eyes to all that the Scriptures had promised about the Messiah. Jesus also told them that as the Father had sent him, he was now going to send them — to all corners of the earth, as his witnesses.

If you want to read more details of Christ's appearances, the stories can be found in Matthew 28; Mark 16; Luke 24; and John 20, or come along to one of our services at 11.00am each Sunday morning at Credenhill Church, except the last one in the month, which will be 6pm for a change!.

Sunday 13th May is what is known as Rogation Sunday. This is the day the Church remembers our farms and prays for the spring crops to develop and grow well so that we have a good harvest. With that in mind we are planning a walk at 3.00pm from Credenhill to Kenchester, where we will have a Bring and Share tea at around 4.30 – 5.00pm, ending with a short service at 5.30pm. If you don't want to walk, just come along for tea and the service at the church (details with where we will start from will be on posters around the village nearer the time, or phone me on 760443). On Ascension Day, at 6.30pm at Wormsley Church, we will be holding a short communion service to celebrate the Ascension of Jesus, followed by supper at the Golf Club. Everyone is very welcome to join us for either of these special occasions.

Elsewhere in the *CCN* you will see that we are appealing to the people of Credenhill for help raising money for our church boiler. We sometimes hear that people think we are *always* asking for money – in fact, as a church we have a very small income, mainly from those who attend church Sunday by Sunday. It costs a lot to maintain our church building each year, and at the moment we just aren't able to raise enough. This is why we have been holding fund-raising events each month, and we are very grateful for the support we have received so far. But for the church in Credenhill to survive so that families can continue holding weddings, baptisms and funerals there, we need more financial help and I would be very interested to hear of any ideas or suggestions. Tom and Paula Fitch have very kindly invited us to their home (78 Ecroyd Park) on the Friday 18th May for a Coffee Morning at 10.00am spilling over to a Barbecue later on and ending around 3.00pm. Please do come along and enjoy the occasion to raise much needed funds for the church.

The Council provided us with over £700 which is 75% of the total costs. This contribution has enabled us along with our own fundraising and the support from Marion and Gordon Batchelor to replace all the tables in the hall and to have trolleys to move them on - a great asset to all the groups.

By the good efforts of the Hall volunteers accessing grants and donations we have during this year have the kitchen refurbished and new blinds fitted. The efforts also mean that we can keep the costs down which is a great help for all the Voluntary groups who regularly use the hall.





BUNTING REQUIRED

We require bunting to decorate the village and area surrounding social club and community Hall for the Queens Diamond Jubilee celebrations. A Pattern is printed below for anyone who wishes to make at least a metre of bunting, but the longer the better. An obvious red, white and blue theme would be appreciated, but other colours/patterns can be used, dependent on what you have in your sewing box!!!

How to sew your own bunting

METHOD 1

From a mix of leftover fabrics, cut triangles measuring 20cm across the top by 25cm long. Make a card template.

Neaten sides of triangles if you want the bunting to be long-lasting - it's not necessary if the bunting is for one-off short-term use only.

Press a long length of 2.5cm-wide white cotton tape in half lengthwise.

Slip tops of triangles inside folded tape and stitch in place with triangles positioned 5cm apart.

METHOD 2

Use method 1 sizes to cut triangles of fabric – we used old shirts, but any scraps of fabric will do.

For the binding, cut 6cm-wide strips of shirt fabric, as long as possible. Stitch the strips together to form the required length and press seams open. Press under 1.5cm along both long edges. Fold in half lengthways and press.

Sandwich the triangles of fabric between edges of binding, leaving a 5cm gap between each triangle. Pin and stitch in place.

Tip: Leave enough binding at both ends to allow the bunting to be hung up and tied in place.
