On behalf of the churchwardens and the PCC, thank you. Now we would like to invite you all to test it out and see if it works!

## COMMUNITY AWARD



Magna nominated Betty Morris, for the Community Award in the Pride of Herefordshire event organised by The Herefordshire Journal and The Herefordshire Partnership.

She was nominated in recognition of over 30 years of service to the community of Credenhill. She has given up an incredible amount of time to run the local drama group, putting on annual pantomimes - initially at the village hall, but when the group outgrew the space, at the Royal National College. Many children and adults from the village have benefited from the weekly drama group she has run voluntarily for three decades. The group put on two other plays each year, many of which Betty has written herself which enables all to be included regardless of age or ability. Betty has helped the group to win many awards over the years; most recently NODA's Best Drama Production 2011 and Best Pantomime 2011. Magna will be performing Snow White in the New Year, look out for details to book tickets nearer the time.

As a short-listed finalist, Betty was invited to attend the awards ceremony at The Three Counties Hotel which was also attended by Paralympian medallists James Bevis and Josie Pearson. Although she was 'pipped at the post' and didn't win the category, she was presented with a certificate to recognise her work for the community.

## DOG OWNERS

Despite many reminders in newsletter and notice boards Dog fouling is still occurring.

It seems that children may also need reminding by parents/guardians that they must clean up after their dog. They will also be liable for any fine that is issued and unfortunately it will be the adult that has to pay this!! In response to last month's item about dogs on leads attacking other dogs. If an owner knows that their dog is likely to be nasty to another animal then for safety sake please use a muzzle, the owner can still be prosecuted even if restrained on a lead. Remember a dog no matter how small can still be quite strong and they have very quick reflexes and can pull a person over if unexpected movement is made.

So it is always wise to have total control of your dog at all times.

## Knit a Haggis!



Use 8 ply fawn-coloured yarn - acrylic will do - and 3 mm needles.

Cast on 8 stitches loosely. Beginning with a P row, stocking stitch 3 rows.

**Next row** - Inc K-wise into every stitch (I think she means K-fb, where you knit into the front and back of the stitch) - 16 stitches. St-st 13 rows.

**Next row** - (K2tog) to end - 8 stitches.  
St-st 3 rows. Cast off loosely.

Noting that P side of st-st is right side, oversew row ends together. Turn right side out. Use fawn yarn to gather round the third row from cast off edge, pull up tightly and fasten off. Stuff firmly through open cast on edge, then gather round third row from this edge in same way as before.

Use black yarn for facial features. Note that seam will run underneath haggis. Work a small vertical stitch for each eye, then work another stitch on top of each of the first stitches to make eyes larger. Work a small V-shape for mouth. Expressions can be varied, as shown in the photo.

## Local Policing Team Hereford Rural North and East

### Police Community Support Officer Dean Wall

An offence of Criminal damage occurred between 9am and 4pm on 10<sup>th</sup> Oct in Credenhill, Hereford. Persons unknown have pulled a satellite dish from the side of the dwelling leaving the dish on the floor in the rear garden.

In Aug the Local Policing Team executed a Drugs Warrant in the Burghill area. As a result of the Warrant a significant and complex Cannabis factory was located underground. The find was significant with a yield projection in the 100's of thousands of £'s. The owner/occupant was subsequently arrested and interviewed and the matter is currently progressing through the court system. This find indicates that this sort of activity could be replicated in many other rural locations within West Mercia. Any information to the Policing Team or via Crime stoppers would be treated as confidential.


