We are delighted to confirm that we have now raised the funds required to purchase the defibrillator and cabinet. We are now just waiting for it to be installed.

We will be working with Herefordshire Heartstart to arrange FREE CPR training sessions for everyone in the village in the coming months.



## 2019 Elections

By now you have probably all had enough of politics; what with the ongoing Brexit talks however this year is a full term election year for Ward & Parish Council positions. Credenhill has 14 parish council positions which include the chairman and vice chairman; these are all voluntary positions. Credenhill also has a ward councillor position which covers Stretton Sugwas Parish and Breinton Parish (collectively known as Credenhill Ward), this is a paid position.

Elections will take place on Thursday 2 May 2019

If you read the Credenhill Community News regularly you will have seen that the request for new Parish Councillors

It is important for the Parish Councillors to be elected by you as this will give them your mandate. If we cannot get enough applications to hold an election the sitting councillors and any further volunteers will become elected uncontested and will serve another 4 years as uncontested councillors (more than 14 are needed to hold an election). This does not bode well for a strong council which will be needed to ensure the village is strongly represented with forthcoming planning applications this year.

There are many issues which will affect everyone that lives in the village so please give consideration for this important role. With your help we can model the village to suit most people. But without your help the present Parish Council will plod on taking decisions which might not be to your liking. For better representation please come and join us.

At January's meeting we received an update from the Orchard House development of 69 houses to confirm that a formal application has now been forwarded to Herefordshire Council planning department. Once the application is live on the website you will have 21 days to include your comments/views.

## Proposed Development of Land Adjacent to St Mary's CofE Primary School

At January's meeting we received the first briefing of a pre-application outline planning for 120 houses on the land outlined below situated on land adjoining St Mary's Primary School.



At this stage only the outline has been designed and an estimate of 120 dwellings has been made.

The developer expressed a desire to ensure that adequate footpath and cycle path linkage to the village would be made and that they would work with Herefordshire Council to ensure that suitable section 106 arrangements are in place to address affordable housing and infrastructure improvements.

The developers will provide updates to the community as the plans progress.

The parish council requested that the developers consider running an open evening in the community hall to share the formal plans once available.

Ward Councillor Matthews has been to visit the residents next to the new development and is working with the schools to find out what improvements are required to service the new homes.

### What can I say about planning applications?

You can say whatever you want with regards to your views on the actual planning application. However please note that the planning officers can only take into account relevant Planning matters and will need to disregard any non-planning issues.

#### **Relevant Planning matters**

- Design of a building
- Traffic/parking issues
- Land ownership
- Noise and disturbance
- Overdevelopment
- Underdevelopment
- Loss of privacy, overlooking and loss of light
- Loss of open space/green space/habitats
- Effect on character of listed building or conservation areas

When developments of this size is proposed the developers will be imposed an amount to pay to Herefordshire Council which will relate to the size and scale of the development; this is called Section 106 agreement. It's important to note that the money will only be spent in Credenhill if we can demonstrate a need for it. It would therefore be helpful if residents can highlight areas of infrastructure that could be improved when making comments.

Dear Friends,

I have become increasingly concerned that as a nation we just aren't very good at being kind to each other and with Valentines Day this month, maybe we could all make February our "Kindness Month"! So here is what Jesus said about how we should treat each other: "Love one another" *John 15:12 & 17.*

There is not one person that Jesus does not love and he calls us all to love one another as he has loved us. For some of us it is so hard to do! But it doesn't have to be a big thing. 
