Defibrillator Update

At the time of writing the Defibrillator and Cabinet have been delivered and we are waiting for the cabinet to be installed; by the time you read this it may have been already installed but either way we will be running training sessions from the end of March and through April we will keep you informed via the Facebook group, this newsletter and the notice board between Onestop/ Chinese restaurant.

New Website

We are currently finalising our new website which will be live from April. We hope that the new improved website will be easier for you to navigate around to find the information that you are looking for. If you have any suggestions for content or have any pictures of Credenhill that you would like to share through the image gallery then please email then to the address found below.

Grants for Not for Profit Organisations

In December's issue of the CCN we informed you that we had provided a budget for not for profit organisations to apply for through Section 137 of the Local Government Act 1972. These grants will deliver projects within the next 12 months that benefit the community. The application form and policy is now available from the clerk or the website. Once the process is complete we will provide you with an update in May to let you know which projects have been successful.



Cost and Quality

As a Parish Council we have to ensure we obtain value for money for services and goods; however we also understand that saving money can also impact on the quality of the product. One cost line we have recently reviewed is the CCN printing cost and its format. The A5 version that you know read represents an approx. £400 per year saving on printing costs when compared to the A4 version and I hope you will agree that the format which also includes some colour as standard is better.

Another cost line we have made a saving on this month is the waste management at the community centre which will save us £100 annually. Next month we will be tendering for the Hedge Cutting, Grass Cutting, Weed Killing, Litter Picking, Cleaning and Maintenance contracts to make sure that we deliver value for money and continue to maintain the standards that are current contractors offer.

Planning

At the time of reading this the consultation for the Orchard House development of 69 houses will be complete. The Parish Council submitted a report having gathered information from people that came forward to express their opinions, this report is available through the planning application if you look under comments or a copy can be viewed in the minutes from the meeting available through the parish website.

Design a Flag for Herefordshire Competition

Somebody from your community could be responsible for the winning design of Herefordshire's official flag.

Over the past ten years nearly all the historic counties of England have acquired their own community flag. Herefordshire is one of just three exceptions. There *are* already some existing "Herefordshire flags" and a coat of arms. But this can only be flown with permission. And the flags you might have seen were chosen only by their designers and aren't official.

The **Design a Flag for Herefordshire Competition** will not only give us a great opportunity to celebrate together everything we love about our county but ultimately will ensure that we get our own flag, free for all to fly anywhere, forever more.

Every entry will be seen and judged by a panel. The best entries will be short-listed and then the people of Herefordshire will decide the winner. The winning entry will be officially registered as the county flag, credited to the designer, and make its debut at an unveiling celebration in the city.

There is no fee and anyone can enter (though under-16s will need parent/guardian/adult consent). Full rules and guidelines are now available, with entries being accepted from 1st March with a closing date of 15th April 2019. The short list and eventual winner will be announced in the summer.

To compliment the competition, a series of FREE high-quality creative workshops will be taking place across Herefordshire, where the professional artists will be taking 'Pride in Herefordshire' as their creative stimulus and will guide participants through creative exploration of varying media.
