# The Vicar's Letter



Dear Friends,

This time of year seems to be so much about remembering. On the 1st of November we will observe All Saints Day with Holy Communion at 7.00pm at 68 Glebe Close, by kind invitation of Roy Crew. This is when we remember the saints of old who were faithful people who shared the Gospel message of love with people down through the ages. On 2nd November we have All Souls' Day when we remember the faithful departed - all Christians, including those known to us. By then, of course we will all be wearing our poppies to remember those who have died in past conflicts - their sacrifice for a better future for us all; and we will be holding a Remembrance Day Service on Sunday 10th November, gathering at the War Memorial at the school gate at 10.45pm for our 2 minutes silence at 11.00am; and ending with an all age service of worship in school.

Everyone is very welcome to join us.

These special days are important to us all, but there is a sense in which every act of worship is an act of remembrance. The Holy Communion, or Eucharist, is where we remember Jesus in the gospels, in our prayers and in the breaking of bread, and it has always been at the heart of Christian worship. I count it a great privilege to stand at the communion table (altar) before a line of faithful people who have come to receive communion, just as hundreds and thousands have for over 2,000 years. Over the centuries, the context and circumstances in which our worship has been made have changed from time to time, but basically we still do what Jesus asked of us - we remember his great sacrifice for us all when he died on a cross to save the world from eternal death - his body broken for us; his blood poured out for all; and all because of his great love for each one of us.




A big thank you to all 36 club members for joining us that day and enjoying the experience of bygone rail journeys and eating somewhere few had even tried.


