

#### Council Tax—Parish Council Precept

It is disappointing to see that the amount of precept required from each property has increased by 3% even thought the total amount that the Parish Council has remained the same between last year and this year.


Herefordshire Council have confirmed that this is because the number of properties now eligible for Council Tax Benefit in the Parish has increased, either from job losses or a reduction in income meaning that individuals now meet the qualifying threshold to receive the benefits. Therefore the number of properties that the precept is paid by has reduced.



#### The Future of the Roman Park

So far the Parish Council are in agreement that the park facilities need to be improved and together with the help of an architect and play equipment providers as well as input from residents we have come up with a number of different plans.

None of these designs are final and any final design will be subject to obtaining funding. It is likely that the final scheme will be delivered in stages.



The Governments objectives post COVID mean that funding will be available through Sports England as well as the Lottery and other schemes.




**Aim:** To create an inclusive local place, for all to be, with things to do for everyone; and to encourage health, fitness, and mental wellbeing.

Gym Equipment features highly on most surveys we do. Items start from £1000 for simple items, to £3800 for item A below.







Initially we have tried to "Theme" areas that are relatable to the vast history in Credenhill: Roman Credenhill, Celtic Hill Fort,
The Old Steam Train Station, RAF & SAS.







Engaging with Teens and Younger Children during the project will be a key part of the consultation process, If you and/or your children are interested in getting involved then look out for events this year where you can give your ideas or thoughts on what we have so far. You can always message us on the Facebook page or email the clerk.







As well as the old favourites we want to invest in new ideas. Free Running or Parkour has become a popular way for teens to exercise and has the "Who Dares Wins" feel about it!

#### **Funding**

The quotes received for the full project range from £250k to £380k.

Current Reserve: At present we have a reserve of £28k

<u>Section 106:</u> When new homes are built in the village there will be a requirement for the developer to contribute £868.00 per open market dwelling built (which excludes 35% affordable homes). So for the 69 homes approved to be build at the rear of Orchard House, this project will received £39k. If the 100 homes development is approved south of the A480 then a further £56k will be received from that development.

<u>Grants:</u> Sports England run annual grant schemes that many aspects of the project would be able to access; the last scheme was for £50k. The Big Lottery Fund also distributes large grants that we can access.

<u>Fund Raising Events:</u> Perhaps you could raise funds towards the project?

NOTICE is hereby given that Herefordshire Council intend, under the provisions of Section 14(1) Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (as amended), to temporarily prohibit the use by vehicles on the road mentioned below:

The U73048, Dovecote Lane, Credenhill, outside no 1 Dovecote Lane. Grid Ref: 345053/243443

The said closure is required due to Replace cover and frame works being carried out on or near the said road, and the likelihood of danger to the public while the works are taking place.


There are exemptions in the Order to permit pedestrian access (and/or vehicular access at the discretion of the Herefordshire Council or statutory undertaker) to any land or premises having a frontage to the above said highway affected where there is no other form of access, and to any access allowing the necessary works to be undertaken

The said closure will come into force on the 5th of May 2021 and will remain for a maximum period of 18 months, (unless extended with the consent of the Secretary of State) or until any said works which it is proposed to be carried out have been completed, (whichever is the earlier), or until determined by Herefordshire Council. However the works are expected to be completed within 1 day approximately. # May in the Garden Summer is on the way!

As bulbs fade and herbaceous borders grow in leaps and bounds, it is now clear that summer is approaching. Sowing and planting out bedding can begin, depending on regional weather variations, and you can take softwood cuttings. It's also time to get back into the lawn mowing regime, as the lawn will be loving the warmer temperatures this month brings.

#### Top 10 jobs this month

- 1. Watch out for late frosts and protect tender plants.
- 2. Earth up potatoes and promptly plant any still remaining.
- 3. Plant out summer bedding at the end of the month (except in cold areas)
- 4. Water early and late to get the most out of your water, recycle water when possible.
- 5. Regularly hoe off weeds.
- 6. Open greenhouse vents and doors on warm days.
- 7. Mow lawns weekly.
- 8. Check for nesting birds before clipping hedges.
- 9. Lift and divide overcrowded clumps of daffodils and other spring flowering bulbs.
- 10. Watch out for viburnum beetle and lily beetle grubs.

Clinically extremely vulnerable people in England are no longer advised to shield, but should continue taking extra precautions such as minimising social interactions and shopping at quieter times of the day.

Funerals can continue with up to 30 attendees. Weddings, outdoor receptions, and commemorative events such as wakes can take place with up to 15 attendees (in premises that are permitted to open).


