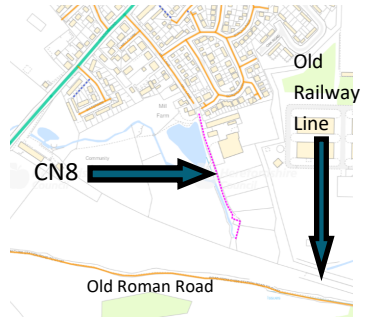

### **Credenhill Public Footpath 8 (CN8)**

This image shows an extract from the definitive map held by Herefordshire Council showing the footpath that leads from Mill Lane over private land (Mill Farm & Millside Stables) to the kissing gate (where it terminates). There is **NO** official / legal access from this right of way to either the old roman road (officially still classed as a road) via the kissing gate and field or to the old railway line (Dutchy of Cornwall Land) via Millside Stables Land. Both of these routes are permissible by open agreements with respective land owners and can be shut of at any time.



Please therefore use this path with due care and consideration to those private land owners; Bikes should give way to Horses and Pedestrians. Horses are unpredictable; please take note of any instructions from those in charge of them.

Follow the countryside code:

### **Respect everyone**

- ◆ be considerate to those living in, working in and enjoying the countryside
- ◆ leave gates and property as you find them
- ◆ do not block access to gateways or driveways when parking
- ◆ be nice, say hello, share the space
- ◆ follow local signs and keep to marked paths unless wider access is available

### **Protect the environment**

- ◆ take your litter home – leave no trace of your visit
- ◆ do not light fires and only have BBQs where signs say you can
- ◆ always keep dogs under control and in sight
- ◆ dog poo – bag it and bin it – any public waste bin will do
- ◆ care for nature – do not cause damage or disturbance

### **Enjoy the outdoors**

- ◆ check your route and local conditions
- ◆ plan your adventure – know what to expect and what you can do
- ◆ enjoy your visit, have fun, make a memory

## The Vicar's Letter



Dear Friends

Jesus taught his followers how to pray and gave them the Lord's Prayer as an example of how to pray. The very first thing that Jesus tells us to do when we pray is to worship God. So after we acknowledge that we have a close personal relationship with 'Our Father', the next thing we say is 'Hallowed Be Your Name'. What does it mean to 'Hallow' the name of the Lord? The word Hallow means to 'sanctify', to make or declare 'holy'.

Obviously, God is already holy and in no need of any help from us in that area, so we are firstly acknowledging his deity, his holiness, and his sovereignty. Secondly, if we acknowledge that he is holy, surely that means we can also believe him and trust in him, we can declare that he is who he says he is, and does what he promises to do, and we can believe that he is trustworthy.

Thirdly, if we believe he is holy and trustworthy, then we will fear, or better still, revere him, and fear displeasing him far more than we fear displeasing other people. We will seek to do his will rather than our own, and yield our will to him and his commandments in obedience.

Lastly, to hallow God means to worship him, glorify and lift up his name and declare it to be over every other name. We declare that he is our King and sovereign in our lives. So, when we 'Hallow' God we are saying that he is worthy of our trust, our reverence, our obedience and our worship. Of course we can worship God anywhere and at any time, but we are also called to worship alongside our 'brothers and sisters' as part of God's family of believers. The church is now open for worship every Sunday at 11.00am from July 4th.

### **Historic Churches Trust - *Music in Quiet Places***

We are extremely fortunate (not to mention thrilled) that the Cellist and Conductor Orlando Jopling has agreed to perform for Herefordshire Historic Churches Trust with a concert this Autumn on 9 October in Canon Pyon Church. Alongside his performing and teaching career Orlando has given almost 125 solo recitals in beautiful UK churches, raising funds for their upkeep as part of his Cello Pilgrimage.

He has such a huge list of achievements that it is a challenge to select just a few. He has worked with the Royal Philharmonic Orchestra, English Chamber Orchestra and the London Mozart Players. He has played as guest cellist with the great UK orchestras and conductors such as Bernard Haitink, Mark Elder, Ricardo Muti and Sir Simon Rattle and has given recitals in places as diverse as the United States, European destinations, Israel and India.

He was principal conductor and advisor of the Royal Orchestral Society for 10 years and Associate Conductor of English National Ballet until 2020. He works as guest at the Royal Opera House and Royal Ballet and has co-founded two opera companies. He is also artistic director of the Roman River Festival and last year formed the Rasumovsky Quartet.

# July in the Garden

## Summer is progressing

**This is often one of the hottest months of the year and a great time to sit out and enjoy your garden. Keep plants looking good by regularly dead-heading, and you'll enjoy a longer display of blooms. Make sure you keep new plants well watered, using grey water where possible, and hoe off weeds, which thrive in the sunshine.**

### **Top 10 jobs this month**

1. Check Clematis for signs of Clematis wilt.
2. Care for house plants whilst on holiday.
3. Water tubs and new plants but be water wise.
4. Deadhead bedding plants and repeat flowering perennials, to ensure continuous flowering.
5. Pick courgettes before they become marrows.
6. Treat apple scab.
7. Clear algae, blanket weeds and debris from ponds, and keep them topped up.
8. Order catalogues for next years spring flowering bulbs.
9. Give the lawn a quick acting summer feed (do not feed wildflower patches or meadows).
10. Harvest apricots, peaches and nectarines.

## **Become a magistrate in Herefordshire**

Staffordshire and West Mercia Advisory Committee is seeking applications from those interested in becoming a magistrate on the Herefordshire Bench where new magistrates are needed in the Adult Criminal Court.

These are voluntary positions; you do not need legal training or formal qualifications to become a magistrate and we are looking for applications from across the county and from all sections of the community.

Magistrates are not paid (although some allowances can be claimed), and those who are successful in being appointed must be able to attend training and sit in court for at least 13 days a year – this is a minimum requirement.

Anyone between the ages of 18 and 65 may apply. Applications are particularly welcome from members of Black and Minority Ethnic communities, people under the age of 50, people in paid employment, and people with a disability who are able, either unassisted or with the benefit of reasonable adjustments, to carry out the full range of a magistrate's duties.

Applications for the Adult criminal court open on 1<sup>st</sup> August 2021 and close on September 10<sup>th</sup> with interviews being held later in the year. Prior to submitting an application at least one observation visit must be made to a magistrate's court where magistrates [rather than a District Judge] are sitting; each visit should be for a minimum of half a day.

Magistrates will tell you what a worthwhile and rewarding position this is, as well as doing something vital within the community, friendships are formed and magistrates enjoy each other's company.

## **KNIFE ANGEL HEREFORD FAREWELL VIGIL**

Free to attend - we hope as many people as possible are able to join us on this special day.

Also known as the National Monument Against Violence and Aggression, this magnificent 27ft statue, built from 100,000 confiscated knives and blades, will be in the city on Monday 14 June and will remain in place outside the West door of Hereford Cathedral until 12 July.

Free to visit and no need to book in advance. Relevant precautions, including a one way system around the statue and volunteer stewarding teams will be in place during the day to help welcome and guide visitors.

**Please help! We need leaders!**

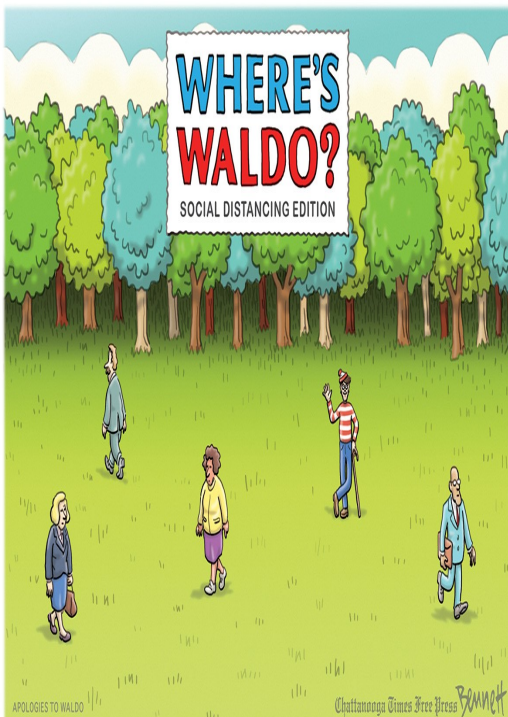
Sadly, there is currently no Rainbows and Brownies in Credenhill because they no longer have leaders.
