Safer Neighbourhood Update

The Safer Neighbourhood Team attended the last meeting to give an update on policing matters in Credenhill. There contact details are in the contacts list in this magazine should you wish to talk to them about any matters; they were keen to stress that unless you report problems they cannot act.

The main focus areas that we are jointly working on are:

- Speeding and other traffic related matters (e.g. Inconsiderate Parking)
- Antisocial Behaviour

The officers reported that the section of A480 that goes through Credenhill returned one of the highest numbers of speed related incidents in the county in recent weeks, so they will be returning with more enforcement. This will continue until the speeding is reduced to a level where community speed watch will be considered.

Credenhill Community Centre - CCTV is LIVE!

In the interest of safety and to clap down on anti-social behaviour; CCTV has been installed in the Community Centre Carpark. This work has been completed in conjunction with Credenhill Social & Sports Club and with agreement by West Mercia Police.

It is now Live, recordings are saved to the cloud for 30 days, our full policy and data request form are available on the website however if you would like a copy or have any concerns then get in touch.

November in the Garden

Leaves are falling rapidly, and wind and rain are on the increase. Tender plants will need protecting from frost, gales and freezing rains. Move plants into the greenhouse, or into a sheltered spot, but if you can't, it is worth wrapping plants or pots.

Remember winter can be a tough time for birds in terms of water and food, so keep supplies well topped up.

TOP 10 JOBS THIS MONTH

- 1. Clear up fallen leaves, especially from lawns, ponds and beds.
- 2. Raise containers onto pot feet to prevent waterlogging.
- 3. Plant Tulip bulbs for a spring display next year.
- 4. Prune roses to prevent wind-rock.
- 5. Plant out winter bedding.
- 6. Cover brassicas with netting if pigeons are a problem.
- 7. Insulate outdoor containers from frost bubble wrap works well.
- 8. Stop winter moth damage to fruit trees using grease bands around the trunks.
- 9. Put out bird food to encourage winter birds into the garden.
- 10. Use a seasonal bonfire where this is allowed to dispose of excess debris unfit for composting.


