Parish Council Update

Vacancies

We now have 4 vacancies on the Parish Council, so please do get in touch with us if you would like to help out with some of the many planned projects we have going forward.

Grant Updates

In December I reported that we had secured £5000 from the Active Green Spaces Fund through Herefordshire Council. I am pleased to confirm that this has been increased to £10,000! This along with £18,000 set aside from Parish Council reserves will be spent on outdoor Gym Equipment for the Roman Park.

We have made contact with suppliers and hope to have a number of options to review at the next Parish Council meeting.

Precept 2022-23

We have set the gross precept to £43,500 from April 2022 to March 2023. This will ensure that you see a 3% reduction from the Parish Council this year.



The Queen's Platinum Jubilee 2022

There will be many events and activities celebrating the Jubilee across the United Kingdom, Commonwealth and beyond in the months leading up to the special extended bank holiday weekend from Thursday 2nd to Sunday 5th June 2022.

We have agreed to setup a Sub-Committee to help co-ordinate the events happening in Credenhill over this weekend; this will ensure that there is a program of events that runs through the weekend without overlapping one another.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that a casual vacancy is deemed to have occurred in the office of Councillor for the **Credenhill Parish** following the **resignation** of **Terence Edmund John Smissen**.

Rule 5 of the Local Elections (Parishes and Communities) (England and Wales) Rules 2006, provides that on a casual vacancy occurring in the office of **Parish** councillor, an election to fill the vacancy shall be held if within fourteen days* after the date of this notice (i.e. no later than **Tuesday, 15th February 2022**) has been given in accordance with section 87(2) of the Local Government Act 1972, notice in writing of a request for such an election has been given to the proper officer of the council of the district within which the **Parish** is situate by **TEN** electors for the **Parish**.

If a request for an election is not received by the above deadline then **Credenhill Parish Council** will co-opt a person to fill the vacancy as soon as practicable in accordance with the Local Elections (Parishes and Communities) Rules 1986.

If there is an election, it will take place not later than **Thursday, 21st April 2022**.



10 Ways to be more sustainable in your garden



Make a difference to the environment with these easy tasks:

1. Plant a tree - Trees are brilliant at drawing down carbon from the atmosphere.

If all 30 million UK gardeners planted a medium-sized tree in their community, school, workplace or garden and nurtured it to maturity, they would store enough carbon equivalent to drive you more than 11 million times around our planet.

2. Water the way nature intended - Switch from mains to rains in your garden to save carbon. Make your pledge on mains2rains.uk

Use a water butt containing water that falls onto your roof instead of turning on a tap from the mains supply, or use a watering can instead of a hosepipe. So far 6.6 million litres of water have been pledged to save on the RHS mains2rains website, equivalent to taking 82,385 baths - saving enough carbon equivalent to charge 1.3 million smartphones.

3. Go peat free - Peatlands are the world's largest carbon store on land. They provide valuable ecosystems for plants and animals and act like sponges, reducing the risk of flooding.

When we take peat for our gardens, carbon is released and habitats are damaged. Keeping peat in bogs - not bags - is a crucial part of the fight against climate change. Our planet's billions of acres of peat hold more carbon than all the world's forests combined.

4. Make your own compost - Carbon saving quantities linked to home composting (as opposed to buying bagged retail compost) are equivalent to 1.85 miles (driven by average car) saved per kg of home compost made.

Every 1kg of homemade compost saves 0.1kg fossil carbon, which could save more than 15 - 19kg carbon, per gardener, per year.

Together, let's get planet friendly gardening!

5. Pull up a paving slab - Garden soils and perennial plantings play an important role in storing carbon.

If 30 million gardeners pulled up a paver and planted 1m² of perennial plants (either herbaceous, shrubs or trees) in their community, school, workplace or garden and allowed it to develop to maturity, depending on the plants grown this would be equivalent to heating between 86,000 to more than one million homes for a year!

6. Plan for pollinators - Pollinators need our help. Loss of habitat is one of the main reasons why we see fewer bees, butterflies and other insects visiting our gardens.

Help slow and reverse the declines in bees, butterflies, moths, hoverflies and other pollinators by growing a wide variety of plants including a mixture of native, near-native and exotic plants to support pollinator diversity.

7. Grow your own bunch of flowers - Some imported flowers have up to 10 x the carbon footprint of home or UK-grown bouquets.

Growing or buying UK-grown cut flowers can save up to 7.9kg carbon per bunch compared with buying some imported bunches.

8. Electrify your garden - An average petrol power tool emits 0.848 kg carbon per litre of petrol used. It's not only carbon, they emit harmful particulate and noise pollution too.

If the 21% of UK gardeners who use power tools switched from fossil fuel to green energy electric-powered tools, it would save enough carbon equivalent to drive around the planet 29,820 times.

9. Help map UK garden plant biodiversity - Help map UK garden plant diversity.

Add your garden plants to RHS My Garden online. Together we can help map UK garden plants, helping to conserve and grow this important biodiversity now and for future generations. So far we have 122,000 users who have added 2.4 million plants consisting of 77,600 different types of cultivated plants.

10. Eat more home grown, UK, local and seasonal fruit and vegetables - Buying locally sourced and home-grown produce can save significant amounts of greenhouse gas emissions.

Eat more home-grown UK, local and seasonal fruit and vegetables from local sources or from your own garden or allotment. Growing at home allows you to choose not to use pesticides – another plus for the planet.


