Vacancies

We now have 3 vacancies on the Parish Council, so please do get in touch with us if you would like to help out with some of the many planned projects we have going forward.

Roman Park Fitness Zone

Thank you to those that provided feedback on the various suppliers that we were considering for the project, the Parish Council considered these as well as feedback from the working group assigned to the project. Following discussion it was agreed that Sunshine Gym, a Telford based company, would provide the best overall outcomes for the project.

Sunshine Gym are a subsidiary of Broxap, a well know Street Furniture company who we have used for many years and well deliver the project by May 2022.

The project will cost £27,983 plus £900 for Archaeology fees, this will come from Parish reserves and a grant of £10,000 received in December from the Herefordshire Community Foundation.

The Vicar's Letter

Dear Friends

"God, listen! Listen to my prayer; listen to the pain in my cries. Don't turn your back on me just when I need you so desperately. Pay attention! This is a cry for help! And hurry—this can't wait."

Psalm 102:1-2 The Message Bible.



On 23rd March we will mark the National Day of Reflection, on the second anniversary of the first lock-down, by leaving St Mary's Church open all day and evening from 9.00am until 8.00pm for personal prayers and reflections. For some people the last two years have been incredibly difficult and painful. This is an opportunity to lament* that pain either to God, or if you don't believe in God, just to spend a time of quiet in a peaceful setting; to give your heart and mind time to express that grief and begin to heal. There will be prayer leaflets available, and also opportunity to light a candle, plant a flower bulb or seeds or add a stone to a cairn.

St Mary's Church belongs to everyone who lives in Credenhill; it is your church; it is the 'spiritual place' of focus for this village. We would like to encourage everyone who has been affected by the pandemic, whether through working in medical care, funeral industry, through sickness (mental or physical), or through the loss of loved ones (having been unable to say farewell in a proper manner due to Covid rules), or loss through illness (diagnosed too late or because of overstretched medical services), or for any other reason, to have the opportunity to spend time in the church. If you need to talk to someone my contact details will be available and you can pop to see me at the Vicarage. Otherwise you will be able to spend time on your own in an informal setting and lament in the way that helps you best.

This is an opportunity to share your heart with the one who made it; to pour your self out and find solace and peace for your heart and soul. I do hope that you find this helpful.

HIGHWAY CODE CHANGES

Rules for all types of road users have been updated in The Highway Code to improve the safety of people walking, cycling and riding horses. There are 8 changes that you need to know about:

1. Hierarchy of road users
2. People crossing the road at junctions
3. Walking, cycling or riding in shared spaces
4. Positioning in the road when cycling
5. Overtaking when driving or cycling
6. People cycling at junctions
7. People cycling, riding a horse and driving horse-drawn vehicles on roundabouts
8. Parking, charging and leaving vehicles

Post Covid Recovery Programme

The Cart Shed has recently received funding to support people in Herefordshire who are struggling with work as a result of Covid 19.

Fully funded places are available for those who have found it hard returning to the work-place after being furloughed, or perhaps took on too much having remained at work, or have found working from home stressful, suffered a bereavement or are in a role threatened with redundancy.

Our Post Covid Recovery Programme offers participants a day a week (for 4 to 12 weeks) at the Cart Shed, to take part in enriching and engaging woodland activities.

Sessions are run by tutors, occupational therapists and mental health practitioners to help build back confidence, address wellbeing, identify barriers to skills' development and explore other issues that might be making work or life challenging.



Professor Alistair Griffiths explains why a seismic shift in attitudes is occurring as ever more evidence shows how important gardens and plants are for our physical, mental and social wellbeing.

A gardening green revolution has started – with increasing scientific evidence highlighting the critical importance of garden plants, gardens and gardening benefiting our physical, mental and social wellbeing. There are very few, if any, other activities that can achieve all of the things that horticulture and gardening can – in particular, the measurable beneficial impacts on active lifestyles, mental wellbeing, and social interaction.

The act of gardening helps us to keep fit and connect with others, to enjoy and be part of nature and to revel in colour, aroma, wildlife and beauty. Simply contemplating nature helps to rest and recharge our brains. Aside from cultivating beautiful plants that delight our senses, we can also grow food and even cures for minor ailments in our gardens.

Gardens and plants also improve our environment, protecting us from noise and particulate pollution, as well as cool us in extremes of temperature and help mitigate against flooding linked to a changing climate.


