Parish Council Update

Role Changes

At our annual meeting of the parish council Cllr Martin Leaton became the Chair after Cllr Jenni Hurcomb stepped down. Jenni is now the Deputy Chair.

Chair's Report 2021/22

Before changing roles Cllr Hurcomb delivered the following report from the last 12 months:

This will be my twentieth year in Credenhill and during the majority of this time I have been involved with Credenhill Parish council as a clerk and latterly as a councillor. Over these years I have seen so many changes to our village but the foundation of a strong community, with a pride for our home continues.

We have sadly lost Councillor John Beavan who served the parish council for over 40 years and the untimely death of our former parish councillor Jeremy Daw remains a great loss to our community. Our thoughts are with both families, and we truly appreciate the dedication shown by both to their parish.

We also received the resignation of Terry Smissen, and all would like to thank Terry for all his work during his time with the parish council.



We have recently co-opted two parish councillors, Sandra Cheasley and Dan Fellows and we look forward to working with both and thank them for joining our team.

To all our parish councillors I would like to thank you for your support and for sacrificing your valuable time to attend to parish matters.

To Ward Councillor Bob Mathews, thank you for working tirelessly on behalf of our parish.

Finally, to our clerk, Lee Harper Smith, thank you for the work you complete on our behalf, frequently going above and beyond the remit of a parish clerks' role.

During the past year we have completed the following items:

- ◆ Flooding near Barlands Cottages on the A480.
- ◆ Installed the sign at the entrance to the community car park.
- ◆ Completed the remedial work for the verge erosion on Station Road, near Glebe Close.
- ◆ Repairs and maintenance projects such as the painting the steel beams.

Our ongoing matters:

- ◆ Bus stop on the A480.
- ◆ War memorial improvements.
- ◆ School transport issues.
- ◆ Play equipment at Ecroyd Park.
- ◆ Land registration at flood alleviation site.
- ◆ Glebe Close surface water flooding.
- ◆ Asset management – repairs & maintenance, electrical repairs at the changing rooms, removal of the water tank at the hall/social club, replacement of gutters and down pipes at the hall and repairs to the resource centre roof.
- ◆ Review of the boundary between Roman Park and Glebe Close.
- ◆ Culvert repairs – started this week and being undertaken at no extra cost to the parish.



Working with our partners we have seen:

- The installation of steps at Credenhill woods making access easier.
- Installation of bulbs, planters and wildlife equipment throughout the village.
- Regular sessions being held by the police at the village shops.

We have received grant funding and completed the following projects:

- Gym equipment at Roman Park; in partnership with Herefordshire Community Foundation.
- Planting 15 trees at Roman for the Queens jubilee; in partnership with the Tree Council.

We have awarded grants to the following:

- ⇒ Credenhill bloomers group £150 (Gloves, Hiz viz tabards)
- ⇒ St Marys C of E school £150 (Sunshade year 1)
- ⇒ Credenhill Sports & Social Club £1,900 (Outdoor seating, shades, and CCTV)
- ⇒ Parish Church £700 (Churchyard Maintenance)
- ⇒ Community Hall £1,900 (New Kitchen)
- ⇒ Magna Performing Arts Group £500 (Led Stage Lighting)

So, another busy year lies ahead, unfortunately due to my work commitments I am not best placed to serve as chair due to time constraints, so, I shall step down and continue in my councillor's role alongside my colleagues.

I look forward to working with you all to improve, protect and maintain our village in the coming year.

Dear Friends,

Bereavement Volunteers
In Herefordshire**

Are you passionate about improving the lives of bereaved people?

Herefordshire Cruse are looking to recruit volunteers to join them in supporting those within the local community.

You don't need to hold any specific qualifications as training is provided.

What you do need is to be a good listener, resilient, empathetic and supportive. You need to be comfortable talking about death and grief and accept people as individuals.

There's opportunities for ongoing training activities and to learn new skills once you have qualified. You will have the support of a Supervisor and regular supervision sessions. Plus you have the opportunity to contribute to the ongoing development of services for clients within Herefordshire.

The training necessary for this role includes 4 x 4 hour core webinars and a variety of other training modules (including telephone support, trauma and self-care) plus the preparation and submission of coursework for our externally accredited Foundation Course.

It usually takes around 3 months in between submitting an application and completing the course. Once you start taking on clients you can typically spend between 2-3 hours per week volunteering. Currently support is offered to clients via telephone and Zoom, with some face to face sessions.

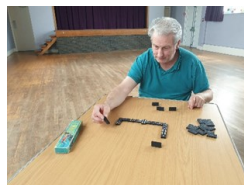
Church Wardens Report

Post Covid Recovery Programme

The Cart Shed has recently received funding to support people in Herefordshire who are struggling with work as a result of Covid 19.

Fully funded places are available for those who have found it hard returning to the work-place after being furloughed, or perhaps took on too much having remained at work, or have found working from home stressful, suffered a bereavement or are in a role threatened with redundancy.

Our Post Covid Recovery Programme offers participants a day a week (for 4 to 12 weeks) at the Cart Shed, to take part in enriching and engaging woodland activities.

Sessions are run by tutors, occupational therapists and mental health practitioners to help build back confidence, address wellbeing, identify barriers to skills' development and explore other issues that might be making work or life challenging.

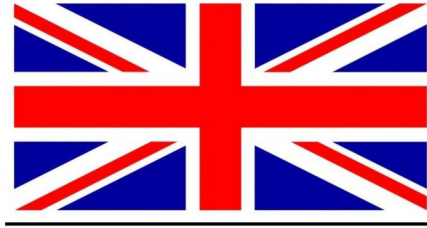
