The resource centre will be vacant from September 2022 after the Nursery relocation to the school.

The Vicar's Letter

Dear Friends,

Let me ask you a question - what are you holding onto?



We can hold onto experiences that happened decades ago that still colour our actions and attitudes. Experiences which hurt or have damaged us will have a negative effect on us and others, and experiences that delighted us will have a positive effect. If we don't find somewhere to let go of the negative experiences and feelings, they will colour our lives, our behaviour and also our ministry if we have one. Jealousy, prejudices, anger, loss when not handed over to God, will bubble away inside and spurt up occasionally, wrecking something good.

Here is a simple way to begin to 'let go of those negative experiences and feelings that may help you to clear your mind of damaging thoughts and feelings. Hold your palms up and if you don't know what you want to let go of, ask God, "What am I holding onto that I need to let go of?" Then imagine it in the palm of your hands. Then turn your hands over, letting whatever it is fall out. Then turn your palms up again and ask God to give you what he has for you instead. We can't afford to go through life burdened by things that people once said to us, or how they made us feel, or wrong attitudes, because they snare us and trip us up. So, get free! Hand it over to God and place it on the cross or the altar, or try Palms Up, Palms Down, Palms Up!

The Keep Herefordshire Warm adviceline is open every weekday from 9am to 5pm. You can call up to speak to a qualified home energy advisor to discuss the best ways of reducing your home energy use in ways that fit your personal circumstances and family life.

Financial support to make your home more energy efficient

Keep Herefordshire Warm administers energy efficiency grants, which can be used to make a range of home energy improvements. Subject to eligibility, grants are available for:

- Heating
- Insulation
- airtight windows/doors
- renewable energy options such as solar and air source heat pumps

Eligibility is based on factors such as income levels, health conditions and who lives in the household.

Call Keep Herefordshire Warm free on 0800 677 1432 to speak to one of their friendly and professional advisors. They can help you find out what you're eligible for and help you with the grant application process.

Are you struggling with your energy bills?

As well as their energy adviceline, Keep Herefordshire Warm also have a dedicated Energy Advocate who works across the county to make sure that no one has to struggle with their energy bills alone. 
