Resource Centre

We are in final negotiations with the Life & Soul Kitchen who want to take up a 10 year lease on the Resource Centre. Provided that the charity are able to obtain the funding needed to convert the building into a modern café facility the Parish Council are in full support of this exciting opportunity.

The Life and Soul Kitchen is a registered charity café that provides an exciting, different and meaningful day opportunity for adults with disabilities. Provide a person-centred service with adults at the heart of our organisation. They were based at Three Elms Business Park and have another facility at Maylord Orchard in Hereford city centre.

Life & Soul Kitchen — Mission Statement

"The Life and Soul Kitchen supporting colleagues to reach their own unique full potential, through empowering choice, independence and self-sufficiency in a fun and safe working environment."

Provided that both parties can agree terms and the grant funding is awarded this will fulfil a lot of our mutual ambitions to support the local community and provide services for people in Herefordshire.




Resource Centre — Life & Soul Kitchen What to expect:

How & When?

The next grant panel decision will be made in November so assuming it is successful the lease will be signed soon afterwards. Following this the grant money will be used to transform the Resource Centre into a modern Café with Commercial Kitchen, Updated Toilets, Changing Places Room, a Conservatory to the rear and further seating outside.


This lease will provide long term stability for the use of the building whilst seeing significant investment in the building and a rental income for the parish. It will also fulfil its original use by providing a place for a Youth Club and learning resources will be made available through the Community Hub.





Culverts

The culvert repairs are now complete! The Parish Council would like to thank Highways England and their Contractor; ECS Hammond particularly the 2 grafters that were on site at the coal face for the whole project.







Finance 2023-24

Highways England paid for the works to repair the culverts meaning we currently have £29k to reinvest into the other facilities. The buildings surveys completed in 2020 showed that significant investment was required in the buildings (The Community Hall, Social Club, Resource Centre and Roman Park Changing Rooms). A lot of work has already been completed however we still have much to do. At the same time our operating/running costs are expected to rise next year with some suppliers already confirming significant increases. Printing of this magazine for example is set to increase by approx. 20% if energy cost remain as high as they are now. We are also conscious that households are enduring cost of living increases in most areas and expect Herefordshire Council to increase council tax next year by 3% again.

Precept Aims for 2023-24

It is with the above in mind that we aim to keep the precept (the amount on your Council Tax Bill taken by the Parish Council) the same for 2023/24. Assuming the Café goes ahead we will absorb our running cost increases into the additional rental income for the year and re-tender contracts where necessary to manage our costs. We hope that the economy stabilises during 2023 and so that we can continue to work in this way.

YOUR MONEY, YOUR CHOICE!

We have produced a draft budget to be discussed at the November meeting which is available to view on the website or on the notice board. This shows in detail how we distribute the precept between the various running costs and how we plan to invest the reserves. This is your money and the parish assets are yours to be enjoyed, we therefore would like to know how you would choose to spend the money—do you agree with the budget? Have we missed something? The budget will be finalised in December based on the information we have at the time. We can only spend your money on Parish matters.

The Vicar's Letter

Dear Friends.

This month is Remembrance Day when we think about those who have given their lives in war and in service to their country. The two minutes silence is a familiar act of remembrance and we can use the silence to reflect on those who have suffered in war or on what it means to work for a peaceful world. I suspect that some of us end up thinking about lunch or even panic that we haven't switched our phone off!

Victor Franki, who was a victim of Auschwitz, suggested that the most intolerable of all human conditions isn't imprisonment or hunger, but lack of meaning. The two minutes silence enables us to connect with Jesus' message, which offers true meaning to our lives and world. He spoke of giving ourselves in love for each other and the world, 'love your enemies and pray for those that persecute you' (Matthew 5:44). He also demonstrated such love in sacrificing his own life, 'Greater love has no-one than this, that he lay down his life for his friends' (John 15:13).

In observing the silence, let's use it to reflect on this sacrificial love, as we remember all those who have experienced pain and conflict.

I think it makes sense to be serious about silence and stillness in the whole of our lives, not just for two minutes as an act of Remembrance. In busy lives where so much is clamouring for our attention, silence enables us to reassess our priorities and rediscover true meaning in our lives. Jesus made a habit of withdrawing to experience silence. He did this before choosing his disciples after he heard of John's beheading, after feeding the five thousand, after healing a leper, at the Transfiguration and to prepare for his death. 'The seeking out of solitary places was regular practice for Jesus. So it should be for us'. (Richard Foster).

Some of you will have noticed that the War Memorial was missing for a short time while it was being repaired and restored and we are very grateful to Deana Pennington and the Parish Council Clerk Lee Harper-Smith, for organising this.

Deana also plants the flowers there and keeps the area tidy; the grass is maintained by the school.

8 Money Saving Gardening Ideas For Autumn

Many nurseries are concerned that high energy prices will mean they can't afford to grow tender plants in spring 2023, and if they do the extra costs incurred will make them more expensive for gardeners to buy. These gardeners, will be hit in the pocket by the same high energy prices. Brexit has reportedly added £90–£400 per trolley of plants, so retailers have reduced the amount of stock they are importing. Here are some seasonal solutions to ease the pressure on your wallet.

- 1. **Divide, Swap & Share** Detach offsets from the edge of existing clumps of early flowering plants such as hardy geraniums, daylilies and irises.
- 2. **Take Cuttings** Some hardy plants can be plundered for cuttings such as quick growing chrysanthemums or fuchsias held over winter in a warm sheltered place.
- 3. **Save Summer Bulbs** Summer bulbs can usually be saved for next year although you will have to lift them and store in perfect conditions. Plant in succession for a longer flowering season.
- 4. **Scavenge Seeds** Seeds from tropical fruits such as avocado, lychees and mango germinate well in a warm place like an airing cupboard and soon grow into reasonable houseplants or patio specimens. Although the best seeds repay their cost many times over, seeds collected from fruits such as tomatoes, peppers and squash should yield satisfactory crops.
- 5. **Treasure Seedlings** Treasure those tree seedlings such as Hazel, Holly, Chestnut, Oak or Sycamore that pop up in gardens. Lift them to fill in gaps in hedges. Consider giving them the bonsai treatment growing them in small pots with much pruning of roots and shoots, using wire to force them to grow into charming shapes.
- 6. **Make Compost Go Further** Mix two parts of garden soil to one part garden compost (or leaf mould) and a cup of fertiliser with every bucketful of the mix makes a less costly alternative.
- 7. **Buy In Bulk** Small packs of fertiliser, potting compost and mulch can be expensive. Club together with other gardeners to buy bigger packs and reduce costs.
- 8. **Be Creative With Containers** Plants are not fussy and will grow anywhere with decent drainage. Use anything you have to hand and get growing.



We Need Your Help! St Mary's Church Organ is in Need of Major Refurbishment. We Were Quoted £18,800.

We asked for this to be broken down and prioritised. The first part was work on the pedals and tuning at a cost of £4,640. The congregation of 24 members have managed to raise this and the work has been completed.

The remaining work in priority order is:

Replace the wind control and gussets (bellows) - £900

Replacing centres of composition fans - £1,200

Remainder of the work which must be done all together £12,386.

We have set up a working group to apply for grants etc but we will have to raise a huge amount of money ourselves. If you want to see the organ restored and able to be used for services, weddings, funerals etc and are willing to help we are launching a sponsor a pipe event.

There are over 100 pipes in the organ and sponsorship of £20 per pipe will raise enough money to get the next 2 priorities completed.
