There is also the Chairing of the monthly Parish Council meetings. This involves letting everyone have their say, stopping certain people talking too much off the agenda and bringing the council to make sensible decisions to move things forward, and trying to finish by 9pm.

We welcome members of the public and they have two opportunities to speak, and we hope more would come and even join the council as we have been running with two vacancies.

None of what we do would be possible without the hard work of our two employees - our Parish Clerk and Responsible Finance Officer, Lee Harper-Smith, and our Grounds person, Emma Jones and our retained contractor Craig Powell.

Also we thank Bob Matthews our County Councillor for his dedication and hard work on our behalf with Hereford Council and their contractors - a frustrating and time consuming task.

I would also like to record my thanks to Jenni Hurcomb for her time given to the council formerly as Clerk and last year as Vice Chair, as she has now resigned from the council.

Lee deserves special mention for his control and analysis of our finances on so many projects and accounts, his skill at getting grants and keeping our precept to 0% increase. This year he has been very preoccupied with negotiating the new lease for the Resource Centre.

The Vicar's Letter

Dear Friends,

Many of you will have enjoyed watching the Coronation of King Charles III on TV or maybe you were there in person watching with the crowds!



I was also one who enjoyed the pageantry (on TV) and especially the service in Westminster Abbey, with the carefully chosen words prepared by Archbishop Justin Welby; the beautiful music with one of my favourite hymns, Come Holy Ghost, sung in English, Welsh, Scots Gaelic, and Irish Gaelic so beautifully sung; uniting us as a nation in a Christian hymn of prayer and blessing.

Not everyone watched it, and there are many who oppose the idea of a Royal succession but what they may not understand is the spiritual protection afforded by a nation who comes under a Christian monarch.

The huge cost of the coronation was apparently covered by the amount of revenue brought in by the many thousands who flocked to London for the event, and of course it is well documented that the revenue brought in by our Royal Family outweighs the cost to us having them. Whatever your views, it does us no harm and we could have much worse, as countries with certain presidents would warn us.

Our church here in Credenhill celebrated well, creating happy memories with our service of thanksgiving followed by a Big Lunch and the unveiling of a coronation bird bath next to the church porch, by our oldest and youngest members of the congregation. God save the King!

Also, since writing last month's letter I have had someone come forward to offer help as a churchwarden - brilliant and I am very grateful; two would be ideal!

In the meantime we have lots of things coming up, including the annual Traherne Festival on the first weekend in June, when on Saturday 3rd, we host a day of lectures at St Mary's Church; more information from me if you would like to attend; or you can download a booking form from the Traherne Association website - and details were in last moth's issue of the Credenhill Community news.

Messy Runner 2023

One of the messiest events Hereford has ever seen heads to the city this summer. Hundreds are set to be dunked in slime, covered in paint and drenched with water during the first ever Messy Runner.

The family-friendly event takes place on Saturday 17th June and is being organised by St Michael's Hospice as an expansion to the popular Paint Runner fundraiser which ended last year.

Early ticket sales have been strong with around 500 places already sold. The Hospice is now urging those without a ticket to book their spot at the King George V Playing Fields event which will see entrants tackle a 3k route featuring ten wacky stations, each designed to get people messy.

A DJ and dance warm-up will get fundraisers in the mood, and alongside the slime, paint and water, there will be a foam party to round off the fun. The powder paint used during the event is biodegradable, non-toxic and will wash off. The sponsor for the Messy Runner is Easy Garage.

Alongside the entry fee to the event, St Michael's is encouraging entrants to raise sponsorship for the Hospice, with a suggested minimum of £15.

St Michael's provides palliative and end of life care to families across Herefordshire and beyond. It relies on community support to fund the majority of its care, with funds from this event heading straight back to the charity.

We began our celebrations with a service of Thanksgiving for the King which included an organ recital of music with a royal connection by Rosemary, our organist.


Thankyou to Jean and Laura who unveiled the bird bath in the garden planted in coronation colours to commemorate the event and we then toasted the King.






