Ecroyd Park— Backhouse Park

The Vicar's Letter

Dear Friends,

Going to church for perhaps the first time, or even first time for many years, can seem very daunting. Everyone is very warmly welcomed; we are an inclusive and non-judgemental church at St Mary's here in Credenhill. You might wonder



what to expect when you get there. So, I hope to reassure you and answer some of the questions you might wonder about.

We hold a once-a-month Café Church at Headway in Trenchard Avenue, which is an excellent way to familiarise yourselves with who is who. It's a warm space and has all the facilities you might need. But if coming up the hill to the church building you might wonder what to wear. Nowadays we don't tend to dress up for church. Wear whatever you feel comfortable in ~ but wrap up warmly in winter!

There is plenty of room to park the car by the church or if you would like a lift to church, let me know. If the door is closed, it will be to keep the heat in, or in summer the heat out! The door won't be locked but it is heavy and needs a bit of a push. Any problems, just knock loudly and someone will open it for you! If you require the wheelchair ramps or need both doors open to get a pushchair in, knock and someone will come and help.

When you come in someone will greet you, give you a hymn book and a service booklet, although we have all the words projected onto a screen for you to see. Everyone says the bold font together. Someone should show you where to sit, but really you are welcome to sit wherever you would like.

During the service there will be two readings from the Bible read by members of the church. There will be singing of hymns, during which an offering is made towards the work of the church and its expenses - you can bring some money for this (whatever you can manage), but if you have a debit card with you, you can give that way too. If you would rather not give money for any reason, don't worry, we are happy to welcome you anyway. If the service is Holy Communion, we welcome everyone to come to the Lord's table to receive bread (in the form of a small wafer) and a sip of fortified wine from a silver cup known as a chalice. If you prefer not to receive you can come up anyway and receive a blessing or remain in your seat.

Most people tend to stand up for some parts of the service and to sing hymns, but if you prefer to sit, that's OK, no one will mind. We sometimes use CDs for our music when our organist can't be there. There will be prayers said, and if you have a special request for prayer, let someone know so that we can include them.

Dear Occupier,

On Sunday 12th May, St Michael's Hospice will be holding RUN Hereford, an annual event comprising of Half Marathon, 10K and 5K.

Each year, 1,000 runners and their supporters help make this one of our biggest fundraisers, contributing around £60,000 towards the Hospice's care costs.

The start and finish will once again be at the Livestock Market on Roman Road (A4103). To make this day as safe and enjoyable for everyone taking part, we have arranged road closures throughout the morning and early afternoon along the following routes:

- Stretton Sugwas roundabout (A480 and A4103) to the Roman Road junction with Tillington Road (opposite Ned Potter Ltd) from 9.30am to 2.00pm.
- Tillington Road between the Roman Road (A4103) and the crossroads near Burghill Valley golf course between 10am and 11am.
- Crowmoor Lane (near Burghill Valley Golf Club) all directions 10.00am to 2.00pm.

A map is included.

Diversions will be in place, with marshals on hand to answer any queries and allow access to and from homes and businesses when deemed safe to do so.

Please be aware that the 5K event, featuring 300 runners of all ages, will take place on the Roman Road between the Stretton Sugwas roundabout and the Tillington turning. This means there will be a strict road closure in place with no access between 10.20am and 11.20am.

Every year, runners tell us how much they appreciate the support from spectators along the route, and we know they would appreciate your backing again this year.



The Royal Maundy (Impressions by The Revd Roy Crew)

I opened my letter box and in the post there was an envelope marked 'Buckingham Palace', carrying the King's cypher. I thought, "What on earth can this be? It can't be another invitation to another BP garden party" (Jean – my wife who died 6 years ago – and I were guests at one when we were at Newtown). The letter was from the Lord Chancellor's office saying that I had been nominated to be one of the recipients of the Royal Maundy this year. The distribution of the Royal Maundy on Maundy Thursday goes back to King John in the 14th Century and these days the number of recipients matches the Sovereign's age, so 75 men and 75 women from all over Britain.

This year the service was at Worcester Cathedral, and I was glad it wasn't further afield; last year it was in York. We had to be at the Cathedral early for security and organizational reasons, both security and organization were impressive. So was the service itself, full of colour and pageantry with the Yeomen of the Guard in full rig with their pikes, swords and extraordinarily impressive and colourful uniforms. I had a chance of seeing them close up when six of them, plus escorts and an officer in a plumed hat carried the six magnificent large silver dishes holding the Royal Maundy purses. There was fine music, state trumpeters' fanfares, and great style; a right Royal occasion. Nevertheless the service had a warmth about it. King Charles, who was still recovering from surgery and chemotherapy, had recorded his reading of one of the scripture passages after which he gave an address which was warm, well-crafted and well received.

The specially minted Royal Maundy coins are in two purses, one red and one white, tied together by their long thongs, and were given this year by the Queen in the absence of the King. There was an efficient 'pass the parcel' system where one Yeoman of the Guard took a pair of purses from the first dish, passed it to the Royal Almoner who passed it to the Queen who then placed it in our hands, going down each of two rows (one before the 1st Lesson and one after), It was interesting to see the Queen close-up, literally at arm's length – that doesn't happen to me every day.

Everything was timed to the second, and organized down to the last detail, but it was a rather lovely service, and I was grateful to have been selected to be one of the recipients.

Churchwarden's Report

The Annual Church Meeting was held on March 21st at Headway. 11 people were present. I (Donna Jones) was re-elected as Churchwarden, Liz Merrick as Secretary, Dorrie Coates as Treasurer and Caroline Martin, Susan Milan, Mike Honeysett, Deana Pennington and Rosemary Wolstencroft were re-elected as PCC members.

The Treasurer reported that the church had an income of £14,995.45 for 2023 of which £6,936.46 was given by regular donations gift aided by 16 families. £2,123 was from fundraising events, £800 grant from the Parish Council for Churchyard maintenance, £1,400 from loose collections, £1,873 from fees for weddings and funerals and £1,200 from donations. The expenditure for 2023 was £14,948.55, of which, £8,000 was given to the Diocese partly to pay for our Vicar and £4,570 on running costs including insurance, energy and maintenance.

The Churchwarden reported that thanks to the Parish Council, 10 days work was carried out in the churchyard, plus there had been some clearance work done by volunteers and a garden had been created to mark the Coronation. Repairs have been carried out to the organ and the gutters were cleared.

Reports were given on Messy Church and Café Church ventures which provide worship for families and villagers who prefer a more relaxed approach in a warm and welcoming venue at Headway.

A report was given on fundraising events which aim to provide community-based activities which included an evening with an organ and flute concert, an art sale, lunches, suppers, disco and a Christmas Draw. This was followed by a meeting of the PCC at which Mike Honeysett was elected as Vice-Chairman, Susan Milan as assistant treasurer and Liz Merrick as Deanery Synod Representative.

We are hopeful that we will have the services of the pay-back group to help with tidying the churchyard again this year but if anyone would like to help please do get in touch. We have had to remove the bins in the churchyard as we do not have anyone to dispose of the contents so please take any rubbish and dog-poo bags home.

We are trying to make the church more user friendly and have improved the family area and provided activities and refreshments. The church is open every day from 10am-5pm for quiet reflection.

Churchwarden's Report continued...

It was lovely to see it used by families over the Easter holidays. Easter was held on the 5th Sunday of March which meant it was our Benefice Group Service and therefore was held at Brinsop Church. It was lovely to be part of a larger congregation to celebrate Easter. Over the preceding weeks we had been distributing butterflies for people to decorate. These were brought to the service as a symbol of Easter and fastened to the cross as a sign that Jesus returned to life following his death on Good Friday and for our reflection and prayer stations we used the rebirth of the butterfly from the darkness of the chrysalis as a symbol of the resurrection.

The cross is in Credenhill Church if anyone would like to spend some time reflecting on this over the 50 days of Easter. We decorated the church for Easter and would like to continue to do this throughout the year but again we would like your help.

If you would like to put flowers in church for a loved ones birthdayetc there is a list at the back of the church or you could give a donation to Jayne Scott or Rev Rana and we will do them for you.

KS2 Techniquest Trip


Last month, Years 3, 4, 5 & 6 visited Techniquest in the heart of Cardiff Bay.


